Recommendations

The Chief Corporate Officer recommends that:

Authority be granted for the City to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Toronto Transit Commission and York University for the purposes of the Toronto-York Spadina Subway Extension Project, substantially on the terms and conditions as set out in Attachment 1 - Confidential Information, together with such revisions as are satisfactory to the Chief Corporate Officer, in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor.
- 2. Each of the Chief Corporate Officer and the Director of Real Estate Services be severally authorized to execute the Memorandum of Understanding with the Toronto Transit Commission and York University, on the City's behalf.
- 3. City Council authorize the public release of the confidential information contained in Attachment 1 upon the later of, completion and final settlement of all agreements or claims with York University to the satisfaction of the City Solicitor, or commencement of revenue service of the Project.

Summary

This report seeks authority to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") between the City of Toronto ("City"), Toronto Transit Commission ("TTC"), and York University ("York U"), for the purposes of acquiring land from York U for the construction and operation of the Toronto-York Spadina Subway Extension Project ("the Project"), which will extend through York U, and include subway stations at York U, and immediately north of York U (Steeles West Station).

Financial Impact

The details associated with property acquisition from York U for Project purposes are outlined in the confidential attachment to this report. Actual amounts expended for Project costs are included in the annual reporting to Council. Property acquisition and other costs are included in the 2009 Approved Capital Budget, 2010-2013 Approved Capital Plan, and 2014-2018 Approved Capital Forecast.

Recommendations

The Chief Corporate Officer recommends that City Council:

- 1. Grant authority to enter into a Lease between the City of Toronto, as Landlord, and 685071 Ontario Inc. c.o.b. as Biagio Ristorante, as Tenant, for a five year term with an option to renew for a further five (5) year term, on terms substantially in accordance with Appendix "A", and in a form acceptable to the City Solicitor.
- 2. Authorize the Chief Corporate Officer to administer and manage the lease agreement, including the provision of any consents, approvals, notices and notices of termination, provided that the Chief Corporate Officer may, at any time, refer consideration of such matters to City Council for its determination and direction.

Summary

This report seeks Council approval for a new lease with 685071 Ontario Inc. c.o.b. as Biagio Ristorante ("Biagio"), for part of the main floor and basement of 155 King Street East, a City-owned property known as the St. Lawrence Hall (the "Property").

Financial Impact

This lease will generate \$228,040.81 in total rent per year for a total of \$1,140,204.05 over the five-year term. The resulting annual rent is outlined in the following chart:

This represents an increase in rent of \$39,770.36 annually (including additional rent), for a total of \$198,851.80 over the five year term. There are no outstanding payments from the existing lease.

(September 21, 2009) Report from the Chief Corporate Officer and the General Manager, Parks, Forestry and Recreation

Recommendations

The Chief Corporate Officer and the General Manager of Parks, Forestry and Recreation recommend that:

- 1. City Council approve the donation of the property known as 2413R Lake Shore Boulevard West (the "Property"), as proposed in the offer to donate submitted by Bell Canada, including future and ongoing obligations arising from the donation, as detailed in the Financial Impact Statement below.
- 2. The offer to donate the Property from Bell Canada be accepted substantially on the terms outlined in Appendix "A" to this report, and that each of the Chief Corporate Officer and the Director of Real Estate Services be authorized severally to accept the offer on behalf of the City.

- 3. On completion of the offer to donate, a receipt for income tax purposes in the amount of \$22,000.00, be issued by the City to Bell Canada.
- 4. The City Solicitor be authorized to complete these transactions on behalf of the City including making payment of any necessary expenses, and amending the closing date and other dates to such earlier or later date(s) and on such terms and conditions as she may from time to time consider reasonable.
- 5. The appropriate City Officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

Summary

This report concerns land owned by Bell Canada, known as 2413R Lake Shore Boulevard West (the "Property"). The purpose of this report is twofold. Firstly, the report seeks City Council's approval of a donation of the Property from Bell Canada to the City as required under the Policy on Donations to the City for Community Benefits (the "Donations Policy"), described below. Secondly, the report seeks authority from City Council for the City to acquire the Property in accordance with a written offer to donate which has been submitted to the City by Bell Canada.

As proposed by Bell Canada and outlined in this report, the donation of the Property will comply with the Donations Policy and the terms of acquisition under the offer to donate are fair and reasonable.

Financial Impact

The value of the Property established at \$22,000.00, was determined by way of an independent appraisal dated April 22, 2009, prepared on behalf of Facilities and Real Estate. A receipt for income tax purposes recognizing the value of the donation in the amount of \$22,000.00 will be issued to Bell Canada at the time that the Property is transferred to the City.

Capital costs that will be incurred with respect to the Property in order to demolish the existing building, remove the fence and develop the site to base park condition are expected to not exceed \$20,000.00. The funds are available in the Parks, Forestry and Recreation 2009 Capital Budget in account CPR115-39-01 (Parkland Acquisition FY2009). Funding for the City's closing costs and Bell Canada's legal charges as detailed in Appendix "A", are also to be paid from account CPR115-39-01.

The operating funding for this additional area has been included in the Parks, Forestry and Recreation 2009 Operating Budget. No additional operating funding will be required.

The Deputy City Manager and Chief Financial Officer has reviewed this report and agrees with the financial impact information.

New Market Rent for the Pipeline Easement Agreement on Galaxy Boulevard

Origin

(September 23, 2009) Report from the Chief Corporate Officer

Recommendations

The Chief Corporate Officer recommends that Council:

- 1. Grant authority to enter into an amending agreement for applying a new market rental rate of \$5,500.00 per annum, net, plus GST, for the period from December 1, 2006 until November 30, 2016 with respect to the existing Pipeline Easement in favour of Trans-Northern Pipelines Inc., in a form acceptable to the City Solicitor.
- 2. Grant authority to the Chief Corporate Officer to administer and manage the Amending Agreement, including the provision of any consents, approvals, notices and notices of termination provided that the Chief Corporate Officer may, at any time, refer consideration of such matter (including their content) to City Council for its determination and direction.

Summary

The purpose of this Report is to seek authority to enter into an amending agreement for applying a new market rental rate for the existing Pipeline Easement on Galaxy Boulevard in favour of Trans-Northern Pipelines Inc.

Financial Impact

This Amending Agreement will generate annual revenue of \$5,500 net of GST commencing retroactively on December 1, 2006. The total revenue to the City over the ten year term is \$55,000.00 net of GST. There are no outstanding payments under the current terms.

Recommendations

The Chief Information Officer and the Director, Purchasing and Materials Management recommend that the Government Management Committee grant authority to:

- 1. Staff to increase the blanket contract number 47013565 and the legal agreement with Ian Martin Limited for the provision of temporary IT professional services in the amount of \$2,500,000, by \$2,500,000 to \$5,000,000 net of GST and extend the end date of October 1, 2009 to September 30, 2010.
- 2. Staff to increase the blanket contract number 47012475 and the legal agreement with Procom Consultants Group Limited for the provision of temporary IT professional services in the amount of \$2,500,000, by \$2,000,000 to \$4,500,000 net of GST and extend the end date of October 1, 2009 to September 30, 2010.
- 3. Staff to increase the blanket contract number 47012477 and the legal agreement with GSI International Consulting Group for the provision of temporary IT professional services in the amount of \$2,500,000, by \$2,000,000 to \$4,500,000 net of GST and extend the end date of October 1, 2009 to September 30, 2010.
- 4. Staff to increase the blanket contract number 47012769 and the legal agreement with Bevertec CST Inc. for the provision of temporary IT professional services in the amount of \$2,500,000, by \$1,000,000 to \$3,500,000 net of GST and extend the end date of October 1, 2009 to September 30, 2010.
- 5. Staff to extend the blanket contract number 47012478 and the legal agreement with TekSystems (formerly Computer Horizons) from October 1, 2009 to September 30, 2010.
- 6. Staff to increase the blanket contract number 47012474 and the legal agreement with Design Group Staffing Inc. (operating as INTEQNA) for the provision of temporary IT professional services in the amount of \$2,500,000, by \$1,000,000 to \$3,500,000 net of GST and extend the end date of October 1, 2009 to September 30, 2010.
- 7. Staff to increase the blanket contract number 47012476 and the legal agreement with IT/Net Toronto for the provision of temporary IT professional services in the amount of \$2,500,000, by \$2,000,000 to \$4,500,000 net of GST and extend the end date of October 1, 2009 to September 30, 2010.

- 8. Staff to increase the blanket contract number 47012473 and the legal agreement with TES Contract Solutions Inc. (operating as The Employment Solution) for the provision of temporary IT professional services in the amount of \$2,500,000, by \$1,000,000 to \$3,500,000 net of GST and extend the end date of October 1, 2009 to September 30, 2010.
- 9. The Chief Information Officer to increase the value of such blanket contracts, if it becomes necessary, by an additional \$500,000 for each of the eight blanket contracts by way of a purchase order amendment for a total not to exceed \$4,000,000 net of GST.
- 10. Direct the appropriate officials to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

The overall total value of amendments (\$11,500,000) and potential increase by way of purchase order amendments (\$4,000,000) identified in the above noted recommendations is \$15,500,000.00 net of GST.

Summary

This report requests that the Government Management Committee authorize staff to amend the value and end dates of blanket contracts 47013565 (Ian Martin), 47012475 (Procom), 47012477 (GSI), 47012769 (Bevertec), 47012474 (Inteqna), 47012476 (IT/Net), 47012473 (TES), and extend the end date only of contract 47012478 (TekSystems), including the amendment of such legal agreements, for the provision of temporary IT professional services until new vendors are in place to provide such services.

The end date extension of the eight (8) agreements and blanket contracts identified above should be from October 1, 2009 to September 30, 2010 or until new vendors have been selected through a new call, for the acquisition of temporary IT professional services.

The amendments are requested to ensure temporary IT professionals continue to be available to provide the required skills and services for existing and new projects approved as part of the City's capital process. This will allow completion of such projects in a timely fashion and will minimize any impact that may arise if IT professionals are no longer available.

In this report, all dollar amounts are net of Goods and Services Tax (GST), unless the report has indicated otherwise.

Financial Impact

The recommended amendments to the eight (8) blanket contracts and legal agreements listed in the recommendations 1 through 8 above will result in an increase of \$11,500,000 net of GST to a maximum upset limit as specified for each vendor with an option as identified in recommendation 9 above to extend, if it becomes necessary, each of the eight (8) blanket contracts for an additional \$500,000 each by way of a purchase order amendment for a potential additional value of \$4,000,000 for a grand total of \$15,500,000 net of GST.

Funds required for the acquisitions of temporary IT professional services for various IT projects are included in the appropriate City Programs' and Divisions' 2009 capital and operating budgets, and requested in the appropriate 2010 City Programs' and Divisions' capital and operating budgets.

Recommendation

The Chief Information Officer, Information and Technology Division and the Director, Purchasing and Materials Management Division, recommend that the Government Management Committee:

1. Grant authority to increase Contract No. 47013098 issued to Dell Canada for the supply of Microsoft Licences by \$2,692,712.92 net of GST from \$5,612,800.00 net of GST to a new total value of \$8,305,512.92 net of GST.

Summary

The purpose of this report is to seek authority to amend Contract No. 47013098 as a result of an over expenditure for the required purchases of Microsoft Office 2007 licences and increase the value of Contract to Dell Canada for the supply of Microsoft Licences for the various software products such as XP for Windows operating system, Word, Excel, and PowerPoint Microsoft Project, Visio, Terminal Services, Client Access Licences, desktop and server lifecycle replacement licences to support the City's current Microsoft architecture.

Financial Impact

The contract value as of August 31, 2009 of Blanket Contract No. 47013098 is \$5,612,800.00 net of GST. As of August 31, 2009, the current contract spend is \$6,033,966.62 net of GST resulting in an over-expenditure of \$421,166.62 net of GST.

In addition to amending the current over-expenditure, an additional \$2,271,546.30 net of GST is requested to cover projected Microsoft licence requirements through to the end of the current contract term of September 30, 2010, for a revised contract value of \$8,305,512.92 net of GST (\$8,690,027.41, including all taxes and charges).

The total contract value increase to Contracts 47011249, 47012078, and 47013072 is \$6,801,277.15 net of GST (\$7,202,058.56 including all applicable taxes).

The over expenditures were covered by Fleet Services' 2006, 2007, and 2008 approved operating budgets which included funding for the acquisition of various blends of unleaded gasoline and diesel fuels that were charged back to the user programs based on their consumption levels. 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Local Food Procurement Policy and Implementation Plan - Update

Origin

(June 8, 2009) Report from the Director, Toronto Environment Office and the General Manager Children's Services

Summary

In October 2008, Council adopted a Local Food Procurement Policy, aimed at reducing greenhouse gas and smog causing emissions generated by the import of food from outside Ontario as part of the implementation of the Climate Change, Clean Air and Sustainable Energy Action Plan. The policy demonstrates that the City of Toronto is committed to progressively increasing the percentage of food being served at City-owned facilities or purchased for City operations from local sources.

Children's Services, jointly with the Toronto Environment Office, is implementing the first phase of the Local Food Procurement Policy and Implementation Plan, as adopted by Council in October 2008.

This report describes the opportunities and challenges experienced during the first phase of implementation and informs the Government Management Committee of our ongoing progress and upcoming strategies to initiate the increased purchase of local food by other City divisions.

Thus far, the following achievements have been made:

- increase in local food procurement of 13.4% over baseline for a total of 33.4%
- interdivisional working group established;
- information session provided to support broader implementation;
- supplier sourcing more local products; •
- adjustments to purchasing practices such as increasing bulk buying and menu planning • more sensitive to seasonal availability of produce has been effective in managing estimated cost impacts of local purchasing.

A follow-up report on the action plan and associated financial implications will be presented in Spring 2010, which will allow for additional research and expenditures information, resulting in an accurate portrayal of current corporate local food purchases.

Financial Impact

The 2009 Council Approved Operating Budget for Children's Services includes \$15,000 or 0.7% in increased expenditures for the first phase of the Local Food Procurement Policy. This increase in funding along with adjustments to purchasing practices and policy changes within

the Children's Services Pilot has resulted in an increase in local food procurement of 13.4% over baseline, for a total of 33.4%.

Additional costs associated with implementing the next phases of the Local Food Procurement Policy for each City Division that manages food contracts as part of their operations, will be reported in the spring of 2010, incorporating product substitutions where there is no cost differential, menu changes based on seasonal availability, and other improvements arising from the Children's Services pilot project.

It was necessary to complete the work without a formal competitive tender process due to the risk of imminent failure of the trunk sewer that could have resulted in basement flooding, sewage back up into Highland Creek, impact on health and safety of the public using Bendale Park, and lastly, the legislative requirements for maintaining the integrity of these critical sewers.

Repair of three sanitary trunk sewer sections was completed within the timeframe required to meet the City's requirements and was within the original cost estimates provided by contractor.

Financial Impact

The \$1.415 million required to fund the emergency repair was not included in Toronto Water's approved 2009 Capital Budget; but can be accommodated from the Wastewater Capital Reserve Fund XR6004 and would increase Toronto Water's approved 2009 Capital Budget from \$504.238 million to \$505.653 million.
