Subject: One Cent Now Campaign – Further Questions

You embarked upon the "One Cent Now" campaign in February 2007 to convince the Federal government to give municipalities 1% (20% of GST total revenues) of the currently 5% Goods and Services Tax (GST). This campaign apparently originated in your office and City Council was not involved in its development or approval.

In 2007, \$150,000.00 of taxpayer dollars were spent on this campaign, without City Council's consideration or endorsement – this issue has never been discussed at City Council.

As a supporter of this campaign has never had an opportunity to endorse it, I submit the following questions:

- 1) Have you formally requested a personal meeting with the Prime Minister to discuss your One Cent Now Campaign?
- 2) If so, what was the Prime Minister's reply?
- 3) How much City funding was allocated to the One Cent Now Campaign in 2008, including funding allocated to Strategic Communications to support this campaign?
