I have received the Administrative Inquiry from Councillor Michael Walker dated April 14, 2009, entitled "Public Lands in Southwest Quadrant – Yonge- Eglinton Centre".

With regard to the "City/TTC Lands in the southwest quadrant of the intersection of Yonge Street and Eglinton Avenue", this property has not been transferred to the new City Corporation, Build Toronto.

Parts of 2200 Yonge Street (Yonge/Eglinton) will be recommended for declaration of surplus at the May 4, 2009, Executive Committee Meeting, subject to the retention of required interests to satisfy TTC operational requirements, with the intended method of disposal to be by way of a Turnover to Build Toronto.

A Turnover agreement for this property between the TTC and Build Toronto will be developed and may lead to the Transfer of a portion of the property or air rights not required for TTC operations to Build Toronto. Any transfers must be approved by Council.

This response is designed to address questions such as those outlined in Councillor Walker's inquiry.
