PROPOSAL

The North York Community Council is considering an amendment to each of the Zoning Bylaws of the former municipalities of York, East York, North York, and Toronto, in as much as those bylaws apply to lands within the district boundaries of the North York Community Council. These amendments would restrict reverse slope driveways by regulating the elevation of entrances to garages in detached houses, semi-detached houses and street townhouses, in relation to the elevation of the driveway where it connects with the street.

The purpose of the proposed bylaw changes would, in the affected areas, prevent the entrance to areas where vehicles can be parked or stored, inside the above-noted housing forms, from being below the elevation of the street, where the driveway meets the public road allowance. At the Public Meeting, North York Community Council will consider the appropriate date upon which the bylaws to restrict reverse slope driveways will be enacted.

At the same North York Community Council meeting being held on March 26, 2009, there will be a separate but related Public Meeting to consider bylaws to repeal each of Bylaw Nos. 98-2009, 99-2009, 100-2009, 101-2009 and 102-200, which bylaws currently restrict reverse slope driveways. The purpose of repealing Bylaw Nos. 98-2009, 99-2009, 100-2009, 101-2009 and 102-2009 and then re-imposing restrictions on reverse slope driveways at a later is to allow a period of time for development proposals, that had contemplated incorporating a reverse slope driveway and had obtained re-zoning, Committee of Adjustment or Ontario Municipal Board approval, to obtain a building permit.

Zoning By-law Amendment Appeal: If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City Clerk, attention: Francine Adamo, Administrator, North York Community Council, at the address set out in this notice or by Fax: (416) 395-7337 before the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment is passed or refused, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision to the Ontario Municipal Board and may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Municipal Board unless, in the opinion of the Board, there are reasonable grounds to do so.


