SUMMARY

This staff report is about a matter that the Community Council has delegated authority to make a final decision provided that it is not amended to that it varies with City policy or by-laws.

The purpose of this report is to review and make recommendations on a request by Daniel Bordonali of Sutherland and Associates on behalf of Wendy Shane, General Manager for Share Practice Management Ltd. for a variance from the City of Toronto Sign By-law No. 297 as amended to permit the erection of two third party illuminated roof signs at the above noted address.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Toronto Building North York Division recommends that:

1. The request for the variances listed in the 3rd column of the table included in page 2 of this report be refused.

Financial Impact

There are no financial implications resulting from the adoption of this report.

COMMENTS

The property is located on the west side of Yonge Street and north of Lawrence Avenue East. The zoning of the property is Mixed-Use District (MCR) zone. Refer to Attachment #1.

The property is developed with a two storey commercial building. Refer to Attachment #2.

Peter N. Aubrey, Ontario Land Surveyor for Donald E. Roberts Ltd., has submitted a distance survey certificate showing neighbouring roof signs. Refer to Attachment #3.

The properties surrounding the site are:

North:	Deloraine Avenue.
South:	Retail stores.
East:	Retail stores across the street.
West:	Residential homes.

The proposal comprises of two illuminated roof signs. The roof signs will be installed at right angles on top of the existing parapet with one sign facing north on Deloraine Avenue and the other sign facing east on Yonge Street. Each of the roof sign will incorporate an artistic border composed of a number of sculptures 1.2m (4'-0") high that celebrates the famous 1932 photograph entitled "Lunchtime atop a skyscraper" by Charles C. Ebbets. One of the sculptures will be mounted on the parapet at the corner between the two roof signs. Refer to Attachment #4.

The statues will be made using special metal mesh that does not rust, and re-enforced with metal re-bar on the inside. The head and arms of the statutes will be made out of epoxy, and the bodies of the statues will be covered with clothes that are hardened with a special epoxy. The artistic elements of the sign will be produced by Sergio Furnari, a world renowned sculptor/artisan.

Each roof sign will be 9.80m wide x 4.90m high (32ft x 16ft) for a sign area of 48.0m^2 (516.7 ft²). The sculpture will be 0.91m wide x 2.44m high (3ft x 8ft). The signs will be constructed of steel. For sign elevations and details refer to Attachments #5A & 5B.

The signs will be top-lit illuminated with energy efficient lighting powered by Bullfrog and will be on a timer that will turn off the lights at 12 a.m. and back on at 6 a.m. The roof signs will not contain any animation or LED features.

The proposed sign does not comply with the City of Toronto Sign By-law No. 297 as amended in the following way:

Dear Mr. Tipping,

I would like to take this opportunity to provide you with additional information regarding our application for two illuminated rooftop signs located at 3442 Yonge Street, submitted to the City of Toronto on May 1, 2009.

The application includes two 48 m² illuminated fascia signs facing north and east. This unique sign application will include an artistic border that celebrates the famous 1932 photograph entitled "Lunchtime atop a skyscraper" by Charles C. Ebbets (see attached). The photograph shows construction workers on the 69th floor of the RCA building, (renamed the GE building in 1986) located at the Rockefeller Center in Manhattan, New York.

Using a number of the statues the artistic sculptured border will generate a great deal of interest with local residents and visitors to the community

The artistic elements of the sign will be produced by Sergio Furnari, a world renowned sculpture/artisan who has the rights to reproduce the images from the photograph. The statues will be made using special metal mesh that does not rust, and re-inforced with metal re-bar on the inside. The head and arms will be made out of epoxy, and the bodies of the statues will be covered with clothes that are hardened with a special epoxy. The metal rectangular platforms where the statues are welded will be bolted in place.

The project engineer will be Leonard Maile, who is an experienced Toronto engineer, specializing in outdoor signs. The signs will be constructed of steel and engineered to conform to City building standards.
