SUMMARY

This report recommends that City Council approve the recommended grant awards for the 2009 Toronto Heritage Grant Program as set out in this report.

RECOMMENDATIONS

City Planning Division recommends that

- 1. That use of the grant awards outlined in recommendation (1) of this report, be limited to only the proposed restoration work approved by the Chief Planner and Executive Director, City Planning Division, and that issuing of the grant award be subject to the grant recipient satisfying all conditions as set out in the Letter of Understanding between the City and the grant recipient.

Financial Impact

There are no new financial implications resulting from the adoption of this report. This report recommends grant awards for the 2009 Toronto Heritage Grant Program based on the 2009 budget approved by City Council.

DECISION HISTORY

The Toronto Heritage Grant Program forms part of the City's Community Partnership and Investment Program and provides matching grant funds for eligible heritage restoration work to owners of properties in the City of Toronto designated under Part IV or V of the Ontario Heritage Act. The Program is administered by Heritage Preservation Services, City Planning Division.

For the 2009 Toronto Heritage Grant Program, Council approved a budget of \$259,000.00, from the Community Heritage Reserve Fund.

A copy of this report will be forwarded to the Toronto Preservation Board at its meeting on November 26 2009 for information.

ISSUE BACKGROUND

Heritage Preservation Services staff sent notices to all eligible heritage property owners across the City advising of the 2009 Toronto Heritage Grant Program. A public workshop was offered in May to provide information and to assist property owners in preparing complete applications.

Staff received 67 grant applications, a substantial increase over the 39 grant applications received in 2008. The independent Toronto Heritage Grant Selection Committee convened on September 11, 2009 to consider 55 eligible applications and make recommendations on grant awards for 42 properties. In comparison, 23 grant awards were made in 2008. Applications were evaluated according to the Eligibility Requirements and Selection Criteria adopted by City Council.

The 2009 Selection Committee was made up of four individuals chosen for their expertise in heritage conservation:

- Dr. Sharon Vattay, Goldsmith Borgal and Company Limited
- Jill Taylor, Taylor Hazell Architects Limited
- Michael McClelland, ERA Architects
- Phillip Puype, The Clifford Group

The 42 applications being recommended represent just under \$1.9 million in proposed heritage conservation work to properties across the City. This is an increase over the \$1.2 million in proposed conservation work for 2008. While the amount of work proposed for heritage conservation has increased and the number of applications to the grant program has increased, the City's budget for the program has remained constant. This has meant the grants to applicants are proportionately smaller. Whereas the Grant Program typically provides grants up to 50% of the total restoration cost (to a maximum of \$10,000 for house-form properties) this year the program has only been able to provide grants in the range of 15-20% for house-form properties and as low as 5% for other property types.

COMMENTS

The Toronto Heritage Grant Selection Committee recommends a total of \$250,000.00 be awarded to 42 properties. The remaining \$9,000 of the Toronto Heritage Grant Program budget has or will be used to support the promotion of the program including: notification mail-outs, public workshop and the printing of a series of technical guides designed to assist the public on best practises for conservation.

The continued investment of local governments in its communities is a measure of its commitment to the infrastructure and quality of life that it facilitates for its citizens. Investment in heritage preservation has been demonstrated throughout Canada and abroad to return significant economic and cultural benefits to local governments. Since being restructured in 2005 the Grant Program typically results in an average multiplier of 4:1 of private capital expenditure for every grant dollar awarded.
