- 3. If City Council approves the sale of the Highway to Metrolinx, authorize Transportation Services staff to give notice to the public of a proposed by-law to close the Highway in accordance with the requirements of City of Toronto Municipal Code, Chapter 162, with the Scarborough Community Council to hear any member of the public who wishes to speak to the matter during consideration of the proposed draft by-law.

The subject closing will not result in any costs to the City as Metrolinx will be responsible to pay all costs associated with the closing of the Highway as part of the sale transaction.

The Deputy City Manager and Chief Financial Officer has reviewed this report and agrees with the financial impact information.

Transportation Services has received a request from Metrolinx to investigate the feasibility of permanently closing the Highway for incorporation into the proposed parking lot.

#### COMMENTS

Transportation Services has reviewed the feasibility of closing the Highway and has determined that the Highway can be permanently closed and sold.

The Chief Corporate Officer will submit a separate report to the Government Management Committee on the terms and conditions of the proposed sale transaction to Metrolinx.

The City's real estate disposal process, as set out in Chapter 213 of the City of Toronto Municipal Code, stipulates that the Highway be declared surplus and notice of the proposed sale be given prior to approval of a sale transaction. Real Estate staff has advised that this process will be completed by the date City Council considers the proposed sale transaction.

The closing process requires two separate approvals from City Council. The first approval initiates the process to close the Highway and authorizes the terms and conditions of the sale of the Highway. The second approval authorizes the enactment of the closing by-law. Prior to enactment of the by-law, the public has the opportunity to speak to the matter if they wish to do so at the Scarborough Community Council during consideration of the draft by-law.

The requirements of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment will be incorporated into the public notice advising the public of the by-law to close the Highway.
