SUMMARY

This staff report is about a matter for which the Community Council has delegated authority from City Council to make a final decision.

This report reviews and makes recommendations on a request by Robert Manning of Gregory Signs Ltd., on behalf of Salvation Army for approval of variances from Chapter 297, Signs, of the former City of Toronto Municipal Code to permit, the replacement of an existing non-illuminated projecting sign (cross) used for identification purposes, with a newly designed non-illuminated projecting sign (cross) on the north elevation of the building at 7 Eglinton Avenue East.

Staff recommends approval of the application. The variances are minor and within the general intent and purpose of the Municipal Code.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Toronto Building Division recommends that:

1. Toronto and East York Community
Council approve the replacement of
an existing non-illuminated
projecting sign (cross) used for
identification purposes, with a
newly designed non-illuminated



projecting sign (cross) on the north elevation of the building at 7 Eglinton Avenue East; and

2. Toronto and East York Community Council direct the City Clerk's Office to advise the applicant, upon approval of a variance, of the requirement to obtain the necessary sign permits from the Chief Building Official.

Financial Impact

The recommendations in this report have no financial impact.

ISSUE BACKGROUND

The property is located just east of Yonge Street, on the south side of Eglinton Avenue East in a CR zone. The property contains a two-storey the Salvation Army North Toronto Hall building. The applicant is seeking permission to replace an existing cross (projecting sign) with a newly designed cross (projecting sign) on the north elevation of the building. The proposed projecting sign would have an area of 1.69m2 and it would project 1.9 metres from the face of a wall facing west. The sign would obstruct or interfere with the windows on the north elevation of the building.

The sign does not comply with Chapter 297, Signs, of the former City of Toronto Municipal Code in the following ways:

Sign By-law Section and Requirements	Applicant's Proposal	Required Variance
1. Chapter 297-10D (14)(c)	The projecting cross sign would have an area of 1.69m2.	The 1.69m2 sign area would exceed by 0.44m2, the maximum 1.25m2 permitted. The permitted area for a projecting sign is based on 0.1m2 for each metre of building unit frontage.
2. Chapter 297-10E (3)	The sign would project 1.9m from the building face over the walkway.	The 1.9m sign projection from the building face would exceed by 0.9m, the maximum 1.0m sign projection permitted.
3. Chapter 297-10E (6)	The sign would interfere with the upper storey windows of the building.	A sign interfering or obstructing a window or door of a building is not permitted.

COMMENTS

The first variance relates to the area of the proposed sign. The area of a sign is regulated in order to reduce any negative visual impact the sign may have on the building to which it is attached, surrounding uses or on the streetscape. In this case, a new sign (cross) would replace an older slightly smaller existing cross. It is staff's opinion that the new cross would be an enhancement to the visual appearance of the building and not detrimentally affect the subject or surrounding buildings or streetscape.

With regards to the second variance, although, the proposed sign projection from the building face would exceed by 0.9m, the maximum 1.0m sign projection permitted, it would not encroach onto a public right-of-way. Staff considers that the proposed sign projection from the building face would not adversely impact the building or the streetscape.

With respect to the third variance, although the sign appears to be interfering with the second floor windows of the building, the projecting cross would be located 0.3m away from the windows of the building. It is staff's opinion that a slight interference or obstruction to the second floor windows would not adversely impact the building or the streetscape.

Staff recommends approval of the application. The variances are minor and within the general intent and purpose of the Municipal Code.







Existing North Elevation Applicant's Submitted Drawing


