Re: Request for Inclusion of Queen Street East on City's Heritage Inventory

Dear Councillor McConnell and Members of the TEYCC:

Queen Street East, east of the Don Valley to DeGrassi Street, has been authorized by Council for study as a Heritage Conservation District. It contains many properties with potential heritage value and the process of identifying, researching and evaluating potential heritage properties on this section of Queen Street East for inclusion on the City's heritage inventory should be undertaken.

This will allow staff to monitor the threat of demolition or alteration of potentially significant properties in the area prior to the completion of the heritage conservation district. Any properties that are identified for inclusion on the inventory will be the subject of corresponding recommendations in a report to the Toronto Preservation Board, Community Council and City Council.

Recommendation 1:

I would therefore like to recommend that the following addresses on Queen Street East be investigated with the intention of identifying, researching and evaluating them as potential heritage properties:
