Re: Municipal Significance designation for Liberty Village BIA's "Give Me Liberty" event

We are requesting your assistance in declaring the Liberty Village BIA's Give Me Liberty Afterwork Party of municipal significance for liquor licensing purposes, at the **April 21st Toronto and East York Community Council meeting**.

"Give Me Liberty" will be Thursday June 11, 2009, from 4:00pm to 10:00pm. We plan to close one block of Fraser Ave south of King St., for this sixth annual community event, that will include an SOP licensed beer garden.

This annual community street festival celebrates the successes of Liberty Village. The event details include:

- Closing a portion of Fraser Ave between King St & Liberty St for setting up tables and chairs, a beer garden and food and merchant fair
- An emergency vehicle lane will be accommodated in our set-up
- local merchants will give away food or price them at under \$5, and meeting Toronto Public Health requirements
- non-alcoholic pop and water, wine, and Mill Street Beer will be sold
- This event will be promoted through area poster promotion and the local media
- It is open to the entire community
- We arrange paid security at the Beer Garden, and will enclose the area with barricades

Once our event receives endorsement from Community Council, we will apply to the Alcohol and Gaming Commission for a Special Occasion Liquor Licensing permit.
