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AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto and the Board of Management for the Korea Town Business Improvement Area

I have audited the statement of financial position of the Board of Management for the Korea Town Business Improvement Area as at December 31, 2009 and the statements of revenue, expenditure and operating surplus and changes in financial position for the year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Board's management. My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit.

I conducted my audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that I plan and perform an audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation.

In common with many not-for-profit organizations, the Board drives revenue from donations, the completeness of which is not susceptible to satisfactory audit verification. As a consequence, my verification of these revenues was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of the Board and I was not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to revenue, operating surplus and assets.

In my opinion, except for the effect of adjustments, if any, which I might have determined to be necessary had I been able to satisfy myself concerning the completeness of the donations referred to in the preceding paragraph, these financial statements present fairly in all material respects, the financial position of the Board as at December 31, 2009 and the results of its operations and changes in financial position for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles.

Budget Figures are provided for comparative purposes only and have not been subject to audit procedures. Accordingly, I do not express any opinion regarding the budget figures.

1. ESTABLISHMENT AND OPERATIONS

The Korea Town Business Improvement Area (BIA) is established as a Business Improvement Area under the management and control of a Board of Management appointed by Council of the City of Toronto.

The Board is entrusted with the improvements, beautification and maintenance of municipally owned lands, buildings and structures in the area, together with the promotion of the area as a business or shopping area. Funding is provided by property owners of the BIA who are levied a special charge based on an annual operating budget prepared by the Board and approved by Council under Section 220(17) of the Municipal Act, as amended.

Although the City Council approved the establishment of the Korea Town BIA in 2004, no business was carried out during 2004 other than the election of the Board members and approval of year 2005 BIA budget.

CHANGE IN BASIS OF PRESENTION FOR 2009

For fiscal year commencing on January 1, 2009 the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants (CICA) has required that the accounting recommendations and disclosure requirements, as prescribed by the Public Sector Accounting Board of The Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants, be adopted for use by Ontario municipalities and their local boards and agencies. As a result, the Board has implemented accounting policies as recommended. The implementation of these policies has resulted in the Board changing its method of accounting for capital assets, on a retroactive basis, from expensing them when purchased to capitalizing and amortizing them over their estimated useful lives.

The effect of these changes has been to increase capital assets and surplus by \$23,564, as at December 31, 2009 (2008 – increase \$42,959), and increase expenses by \$19,395 for the year ended December 31, 2009 (2008 – increase expenses by \$11,298). In addition, the opening 2008 comparative figures have been adjusted to reflect the retroactive application of the recommendations, resulting in an increase in surplus by \$60,257.

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements are the representation of management and have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles for local governments as prescribed by the Public Sector Accounting Board (PSAB) of the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants (CICA), the most significant of which are as follows:

- (a) Revenues and expenditures are recorded using the accrual basis of accounting.
- (b) Capital assets

Purchased capital assets are recorded at cost. Amortization is calculated on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful lives of the assets as follows:

Flags and banners	3 years
Street & Christmas lights	5 years
Street furniture	5 years
Planters	5 years

(c) Services provided without charge by the City of Toronto and others are not recorded in these financial statements.

4. CITY OF TORONTO - SPECIAL CHARGES

Special charges levied by the City are collected and remitted to the Board by the City. The total special charges outstanding consist of amounts collected by the City not yet remitted to the Board and amounts uncollected by the City.

The Board records special charges receivable net of an allowance for uncollected amounts. The special charges receivable from the City of Toronto are comprised of:
