Project 1

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| Neighbourhood | Jamestown |
| Project Sponsor | Afri-Can Food Basket on behalf of the Jamestown Working Together Group |
| Project name: | Jamestown Neighbourhood Food Centre |
| Project Description | The project will provide kitchen equipment to make a renovated TCHC site useable for food preparation and food animation activities. The project request also includes resources for animation of food-related activities in the kitchen and in community to increase local gardens, leadership development, community involvement in food planning and implementation, support for economic development through food, community celebrations and gardening training. |
| Requested amount | \$44,658.00 |
| Recommended amount | \$25,000.00 for the priority of kitchen equipment. |
| Comments: | This project will deliver activities at 6 sites in Jamestown. Funding is recommended to address the project priority for kitchen equipment. The TCHC capital support is confirmed. |

Added activities such as special event dinners and sharing recipe resources will be undertaken |

| Project Description | Shake, Bake and Grow will work with preschool and school age children (3 to 12 years) and their caregivers to provide programs that encourage physical activity (SHAKE), the preparation of simple, healthy and made-from-scratch snacks (BAKE) and the opportunity to learn about local produce and GROW our own food. The sessions will be 2.5 hours long for 5 days for two week sessions and will serve 25 families per cycle, for a total of 150 families served over a 3 month period. The project will operate on an 18 month timeline. |

| Recommended amount | \$17,020.00 |
| Comments: | This project will be offered at the Agincourt Child and Family Centre and at the Chester Le Community Corner. |

A food asset map has been completed and a food strategy advisory group has developed a local food strategy to be implemented in the 3 priority neighbourhoods and nearby communities. Each neighbourhood has identified key projects that are ready to move ahead, and activities include gardens, markets, community kitchens, youth engagement through food. |
