PROPOSAL

The application proposes to demolish one 3-bedroom rental townhouse at 200 Keele Street and replace it with a 3-bedroom 'back-to-back' style townhouse as part of a new condominium townhouse block. A Tenant Relocation and Assistance Plan has also been submitted as part of the application.

A Rental Housing Demolition and Conversion application (08 208852 WET 00 RH) under Section 111 of the City of Toronto Act (Chapter 667 of the Municipal Code) has been made to permit the demolition. Under the *City of Toronto Act*, the demolition of a rental property with six or more dwelling units is prohibited without a permit obtained from the City. A related application to amend the Zoning By-law and the Official Plan (08 208726 WET 13 OZ) under the *Planning Act* has also been made and will be considered at the same time. Decisions by City Council on the refusal or approval of the Rental Housing Demolition and Conversion application are not subject to appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board.


