



## STAFF REPORT ACTION REQUIRED

### Bartlett Avenue North – One Hour Maximum Parking Regulation

#### SUMMARY

This staff report is about a matter that Community Council has delegated authority from City Council to make a final decision.

Transportation Services is requesting approval to introduce a one-hour maximum parking regulation from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on the east and west sides of Bartlett Avenue North, from Geary Avenue to a point 29.2 metres further south.

The one-hour regulation will result in more parking opportunities for patrons of local businesses.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

**Transportation Services recommends that Etobicoke York Community Council:**

1. Approve the introduction of a one-hour maximum parking regulation from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on the east and west sides of Bartlett Avenue North, from Geary Avenue to a point 29.2 metres further south.

#### ISSUE BACKGROUND

Councillor Cesar Palacio, on behalf of area residents, requested that Transportation Services staff investigate introducing a maximum one-hour parking regulation from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on the east and west sides of Bartlett Avenue North, between Geary Avenue and the CPR rail corridor. A map of the area is Attachment 1.

## **COMMENTS**

Bartlett Avenue North, between Geary Avenue and the CPR corridor, is a 12.8 metre wide, two lane local road with sidewalks on the east and west sides of the street and a 40 km/h speed limit. There is no TTC service on Bartlett Avenue.

Parking is currently allowed for a maximum period of three hours on the east and west sides of Bartlett Avenue North, from Geary Avenue to the CPR railway.

Introducing a one-hour maximum parking regulation will ensure that vehicles are not parked for excessive durations and provide more parking opportunities for business patrons.
