Installation of an On-Street Parking Space for Persons with Disabilities: Airdrie Road

SUMMARY

This staff report is about a matter that the Community Council has delegated authority to make a final decision, provided that it is not amended so that it varies with City policy or by-laws.

To obtain approval to install an on-street parking space for persons with disabilities on the south side of Airdrie Road adjacent to 1335 Bayview Avenue.

The installation of an on-street parking space for persons with disabilities will address the needs of the resident of 1335 Bayview Avenue, while only reducing the available onstreet parking by one space.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Transportation Services Division recommends that North York Community Council:

1. Approve the installation of one on-street parking space for persons with disabilities on the south side of Airdrie Road, between a point 47.0 metres east of Bayview Avenue and a point 5.5 metres east thereof.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

All costs associated with the installation of an on-street parking space for persons with disabilities on Airdrie Road are included in the Transportation Services Division's 2010 Operating Budget estimate.

ISSUE BACKGROUND

The Transportation Services Division received a request from a resident of 1335 Bayview Avenue to investigate the feasibility of installing an on-street parking space for persons with disabilities on the south side of Airdrie Road adjacent to their residence.

COMMENTS

Airdrie Road between Bayview Avenue and Heather Road is a local residential roadway with a pavement width of approximately 8.5 metres and has municipal sidewalks on both sides of the roadway. Currently, on-street parking for a maximum period of three hours exists on both sides of Airdrie Road.

The applicant is a holder of a valid "Disabled Person Parking Permit" issued by the Ministry of Transportation of Ontario.

The requested location of the designated parking space would be on south side of Airdrie Road located at a point 47 metres east of Bayview Avenue and a point 5.5 metres east thereof. This designated parking space would be adjacent to 1335 Bayview Avenue the home of the resident requesting the creation of the designated parking space. The creation of this designated parking space will not result in the deprivation of more than one on-street parking space on Airdrie Road.

Councillor John Parker has been advised of the recommendations contained in this staff report.
