# Report Title Columbarium – 160 Beecroft Road

#### **SUMMARY**

York Cemetery in the former City of North York will commence construction of a columbarium with an area of approximately 58 square metres and with a height of approximately 3.5 meters. The owner was issued a Building Permit on October 22, 2009 to construct the columbarium which will contain approximately 441 niches.

The owner is required to obtain consent from the Registrar, Ministry of Consumer and Business Services under the *Cemeteries Act (Revised)* as the columbarium is larger than 15 cubic metres. This requires the municipality to post a "Notice of Decision in a local newspaper" (s.5 (3) (b)). The posting of a "Notice of Decision" will require a Council resolution.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

**Toronto Building, North York District recommends that:** 

- 1. City Council authorize the Clerk for the City of Toronto to provide public notice, costs to be paid by the owner, of the establishment of a columbarium within the York Cemetery at 160 Beecroft Road, Toronto, Ontario; and
  - (a) to send a copy of City Council's decision to the applicant and the Registrar, Ministry of Consumer and Business Services, Cemeteries Regulation Unit; and

2. City Council authorize and direct the appropriate City officials to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

## **Financial Impact**

There are no financial implications resulting from the adoption of this report.

#### ISSUE BACKGROUND

York Cemetery is located between Beecroft Road and the valley of the Don River, north of Sheppard Avenue. The cemetery is owned and operated by the Mount Pleasant Group of Cemeteries, a private, non-profit, non-denominational cemetery operator. The York Cemetery was licensed by the Province in 1944. The cemetery contains a chapel and visitation center, mausoleum and columbaria as well as maintenance facilities. The bulk of the property is developed with in-ground burials.

The owners of the cemetery intend to commence construction of a columbarium on their property, pursuant to the issuance of the building permit in October 2009. As the new columbarium will be larger in size than 15 cubic meters, the applicant is required to obtain consent from the Registrar, Ministry of Consumer and Business Services.

#### **COMMENTS**

On October 22, 2009, York Cemetery was issued a building permit to construct a columbarium which is a permitted use under the existing zoning. The proposed structure was not subject to a site plan control application as it was not deemed to be development as defined. The location of the columbarium is more than 100 metres from the nearest property lines and given the relatively small overall size of the structure will not be visible from surrounding properties and is located between Senlac and Beecroft Roads, approximately 181 metres west of Beecroft Road and 113 metres north of the southerly property line of the cemetery. In order to obtain the approval of the Ministry, the applicant requires the municipality to post a "Notice of Decision in a local newspaper" (s.5 (3) (b)). The posting of a "Notice of Decision" will require a Council resolution.



We are the planning consultants to the Mount Pleasant Group of Cemeteries ("MPGC"), owners and operators of the York Cemetery, extending between Beecroft Road and the Don River Valley in the former City of North York.

The Mount Pleasant Group has been issued a building permit to construct a columbarium structure of approximately 58 square metres in total floor within that part of the cemetery located between Beecroft Road and Senlac Road. The columbarium will provide for 441 niches (for the purpose of storing the ashes of human remains that have been cremated).

The location of the columbarium is more than 100 metres from the nearest property lines and given the relatively small overall size of the structure will not be visible from surrounding properties.

The proposed columbarium will be roofed and offer protection from the elements and security for the glass front niches which will be provided.

In accordance with the Cemeteries Act (revised) our client requires that Council issue a Notice of Decision to allow for licensing of the columbarium.

For your convenience and reference we have provided a draft of the Notice of Decision which would be posted in a local newspaper as well as suggested report which you may wish to use for reporting to Council. Each is similar to reports prepared in other parts of the City (Etobicoke and Scarborough) where other cemetery related buildings have been developed.

We understand that the cost of publishing the Notice of Decision will be invoiced to our client and that will be paid immediately upon receipt of an invoice.

We will provide word versions of these materials for your use, upon request.

We understand that this matter could be included on the January 12, 2010 agenda of Community Council and we would hope that would be the case. We would also request confirmation whether this matter will need to be considered by Toronto Council prior to issuance of the Notice.
