## Recommendation

The North York Community Preservation Panel requests that the Chair of the Toronto Preservation Board write a letter on behalf of the Board to the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing asking that "the Minister consider stronger placement for Cultural Heritage Resources and Archaeology, including tiered content for the Policy comparable to other parts of the Provincial Policy Statement".

## **Background**

The Province is conducting a review of the Provincial Policy Statement, 2005 (PPS). The PPS sets out the Ontario government's policy direction for land use planning and development. The PPS supports the provincial goal of strong, livable and healthy communities. The Province is requesting input on how the PPS is working and whether any changes are needed to the PPS to protect provincial interests and to make sure that the PPS is adequately addressing emerging land use issues.
