In your letter of November 3, 2009, you requested that a poll be conducted to determine if there was sufficient neighbourhood support for a Boulevard Café licence at 296 Brunswick Avenue.

Ballots were mailed out on November 19, 2009 with the last date for filing a response being December 18, 2009. The following is the poll result:

In accordance with the provisions of the former City of Toronto, Municipal Code, Chapter 313 a public poll was conducted and the results have been received.



The Annex Live, 296 Brunswick Avenue Boulevard Café Permit Application Appeal

The owner of The Annex Live at 296 Brunswick Avenue applied for a Boulevard Café Permit in the fall of 2009. A poll was conducted by the City Clerk between November 19<sup>th</sup> and December 19<sup>th</sup>, 2009.

An insufficient number of responses were received to the poll.

This particular boulevard café application has a long history in the neighbourhood. My office has convened a number of meetings with the applicant, local residents, and the Harbord Village Residents Association.

The consensus emerging from these community meetings is that a Boulevard Café should be permitted at this location as long as the following conditions are applied:

- 1. 9:30 pm closing time. All food, drinks, tables and chairs must be cleared from the patio by this time.
- 2. Capacity: 16 people
- 3. Tables will seat parties of no more than 4 people. (This is because noise levels increase disproportionately with the number of patrons at a table.)



- 4. A sound barrier must be erected on the north side of the patio to mitigate noise generated by Future Bistro to the north. As well, sound barriers must be erected on the south side of the patio along the alley and in front (along Brunswick) to create an enclosed space.
- 5. Customers ordering alcohol must order food.
- 6. No music will be permitted on the patio.
- 7. The double doors must always be closed when music is played inside the building.
- 8. Failure to meet these conditions will result in the patio license being withdrawn.

I would like to recommend that the Toronto and East York Community Council approve the Boulevard Café Application for The Annex Live at 296 Brunswick Avenue with the above listed conditions.
