To the Compliance Audit Committee:

Please find below the reasons motivating a request for a compliance audit of Justin Di Ciano, Candidate for City Councillor –Etobicoke Lakeshore Ward 5.

Given that:

1. All that is required for a Compliance Audit to be granted is that there be a reasonable probability of a single violation of the Municipal Elections Act; and
2. A Compliance Audit may exceed the scope of the submission which requested it; and
3. The Act must be interpreted with a view to rigidly maintaining election spending limits in order to preserve fair elections and equal access to the democratic process;

I would like to bring the following items to the Committee's attention with this submission:

1. The Justin Di Ciano Campaign did not report any cost related to its rental of two commercial units at 3391 Bloor Street West for its campaign headquarters; (Please see Exhibit 1)
2. The Justin Di Ciano Campaign did not report the cost related to the provision of computers, printers, televisions, and other office equipment located in the campaign headquarters;
3. The Justin Di Ciano Campaign did not report the cost related to its use of second truck, trailer, and moose as a mobile election sign
  - a. The cost/value attributed to the first truck/trailer combination is listed by the campaign as \$ 1243.00 (Please see Exhibit 3)
4. The Justin Di Ciano Campaign did not report all the costs related to “creative development and design of all 2010 election campaign materials including campaign identity and branding, brochures, advertising, election signage, direct marketing and campaign headquarters graphics” by IGNITER.CA for services as noted on the company's website; (Please see Exhibit 4)
5. The Justin Di Ciano Campaign did not report the cost related to a second door hanger publication “Meet Justin”. Another door hanger that was accounted for had a reported value of \$490.00 (Please see Exhibit 5)
6. The Justin Di Ciano Campaign did not report the cost related to the rental or use of Islington Junior Middle School Gym on Saturday October 23, 2010. The Toronto and District Public School Board may not make contributions to the political campaigns of candidates therefore the cost or value of this school facility must be accounted for.

7. The Justin Di Ciano Campaign did not report the cost related to the printing and distribution of the "Rob Ford Photo – Vote Justin Di Ciano" flyer distributed throughout the ward on Election Day. (Please see Exhibit 7)
8. The Justin Di Ciano Campaign did not report the cost related to (or donation of) the printing and distribution of the "Save The Queensway – Dunpar Developments Endorsement Letter" distributed to numerous homes during the election campaign. (Please see Exhibit 8)
9. The Justin Di Ciano Campaign did not report the cost related to the use of automated telephone dialer (Robo-caller) messages made throughout the campaign, namely an endorsement call by Jean Augustine, and several messages on Election Day.
10. The Justin Di Ciano Campaign improperly reported the cost related to an advertisement in the SNAP Etobicoke newspaper as a fundraising expense even though the majority of the full page advertisement was worded and designed to promote his election. This amount should be categorized as an expense subject to the spending limit. The invoice # V-052-011494 indicates a value of \$ 1491.60 (Please see Exhibit 10)
11. The Justin Di Ciano Campaign reported a labour cost related to fundraising activity in the amount of \$ 4,725.00. There is no invoice for this amount submitted with the statements, and no further explanation as to who performed any work or what it entailed.
12. The Justin Di Ciano Campaign did not report the cost related to website design performed by its supplier JUNTOS. This company quotes a cost of in the range of \$ 10,000.00 to design a fully functioning political website. While one invoice was submitted for a value of \$347.79, the work done appears to exceed that amount. (Please see Exhibit 12)
13. The Justin Di Ciano Campaign did not report the cost related to the printing and distribution before Election Day of a postcard promoting a Pumpkin Carving Event held by the candidate Justin Di Ciano on October 17, 2011. This piece can be seen as self-promotion as the candidate's picture and name are included on the piece. (Please see Exhibit 13)

I respectfully submit that, due to the many apparent omissions in the Justin Di Ciano Campaign financial statements, a compliance audit is warranted to determine the precise amount of expenses incurred by the campaign and whether Section 76(4) of the Act was violated by exceeding the prescribed spending limit of \$40,969.45.

This Expense should be categorized as an election expense as solicing contributions is incidental compared to self promotion.



## Fund-raising functions

The definition of a fund-raising function has been changed to 'an event or activity held by or on behalf of a candidate for the purpose of raising funds for his or her election campaign'.

Under the *Municipal Elections Act, 1996* the cost of holding fund-raising functions does not include costs related to the following:

- 'events or activities that are organized for such purposes as promoting public awareness of a candidate and at which the soliciting of contributions is incidental; or
- promotional materials in which the soliciting of contributions is incidental'

## Surplus

Candidates will be required to submit any surplus to the Clerk at the time of filing the financial statement.

Candidate campaign surpluses will be available to candidates for expenses related to recounts, controverted election proceedings or compliance audits but will otherwise become the property of the municipality.

## Financial statements

Candidates will be required to include more detail in the financial statements (see page 77 for more details).

Candidates will be required to file a court application for an extension of the filing deadline **before** the deadline itself rather than within 91 days after the deadline.

After the filing date, candidate's financial statements, including the names and addresses of contributors who contributed over \$100, will be posted on the City's website.



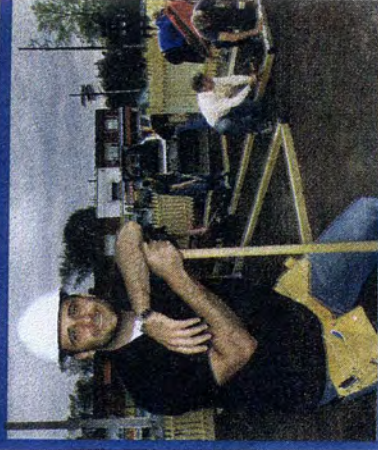
