


Canada's Largest City, Fourth in North America

Largest North American Cities By Population - 2011
















High Rise Buildings Under Construction North American Cities – January 2013






Economic Challenge: Population Growing Faster than Jobs








Economic Challenge: Unemployment Rate Too High






Economic Challenge: Unemployment Gap Widening with Canada








Target: Increase Employment - 20,000 jobs annually






Target: 60% of New Jobs in 'Economic Driver' Sectors

A. Make Toronto the Most Competitive Big City in North America for Business

A.1 Accelerate investments in commercial and industrial developments that enhance the City's property tax base and/or creates permanent jobs.


A.2 Improve cost competitiveness that enhances the City's property tax base and/or creates permanent jobs

Implementation Recommendations

 City Council approve the establishment of an Economic Growth and Job Creation Advisory Committee led by the Mayor with membership drawn from business, labour and academia, and the United Way, with an emphasis on diversity, as well as the Chair of the Economic Development Committee, Chair of the Planning & Growth Management Committee and Chair of the Public Works & Infrastructure Committee and two Councillors at large.





Implementation Recommendations (cont'd)

 City Council approve an Economic Growth and Job Creation Staff Team, chaired by the General Manager, Economic Development & Culture, with membership drawn from City Divisions, Agencies, Boards, Commissions & Corporations that impact economic growth and job creation.





Implementation Recommendations (cont'd)

 City Council request the Economic Growth and Job Creation Staff Team, to report to the Economic Development Committee on how the economic growth and job creation targets will be achieved and identify appropriate lines of accountability while recognizing the multistakeholder nature of collaborative initiatives.

 City Council request the City Manager to investigate the inclusion of an "Economic Lens" in City Staff Reports to Council.







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
