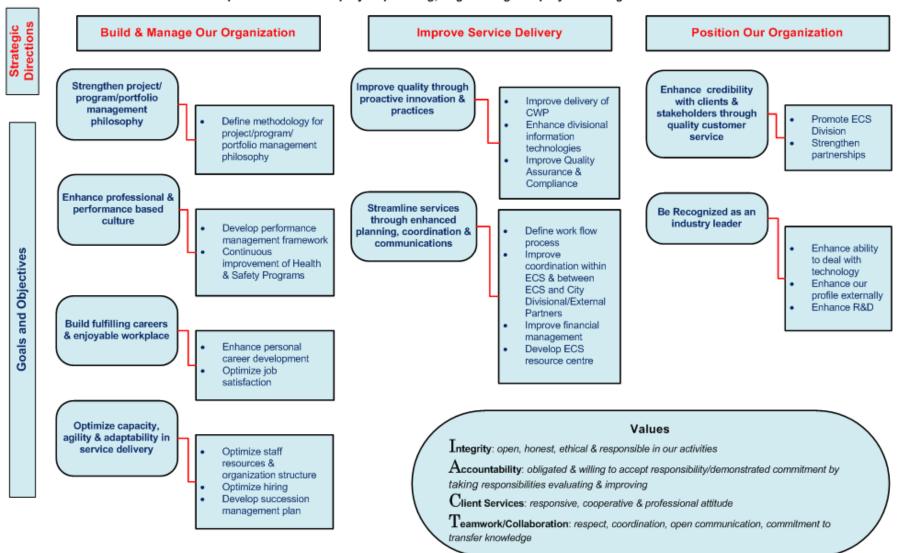

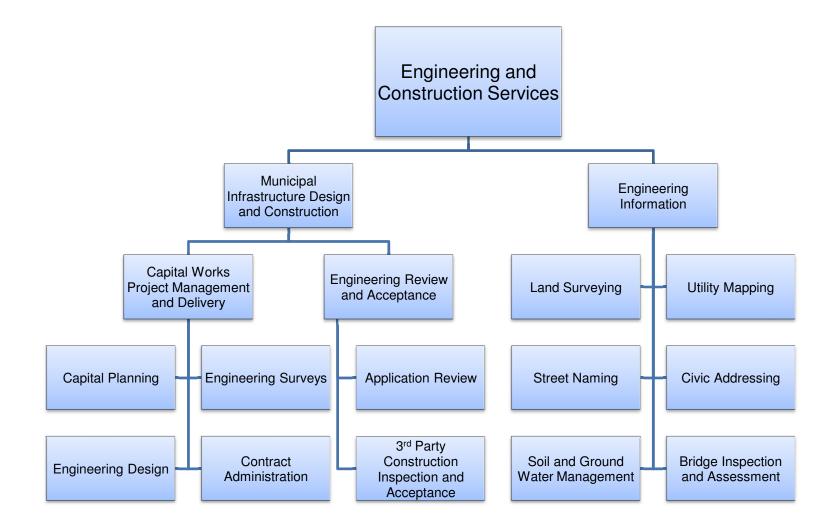

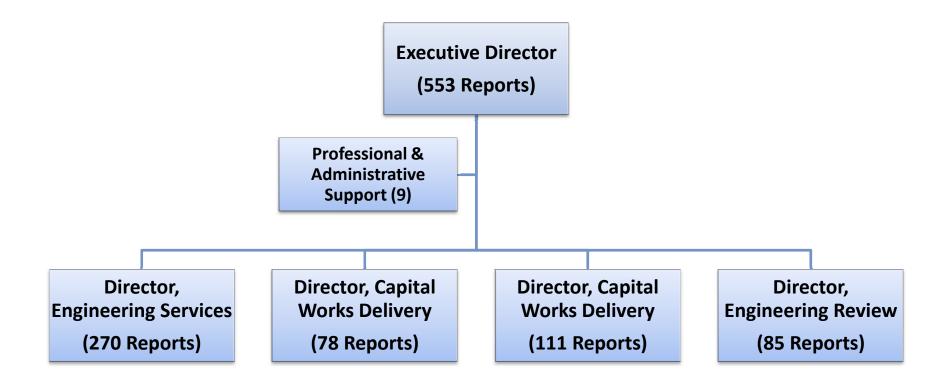


ECS Program Map

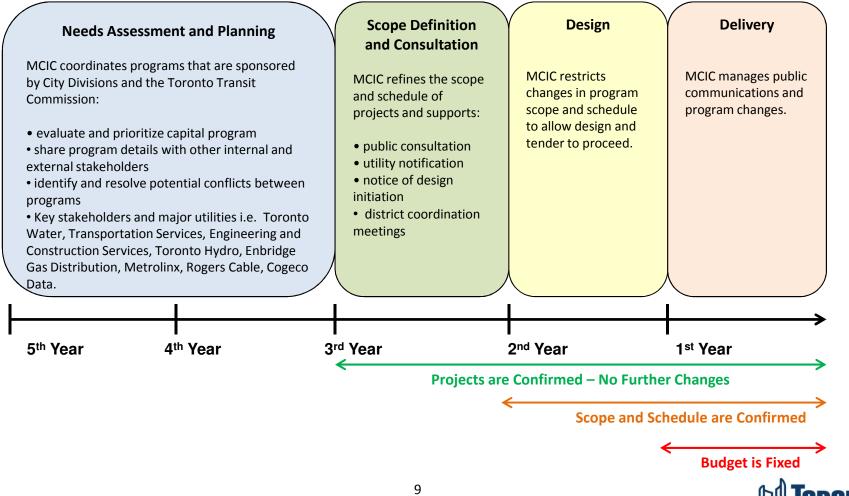

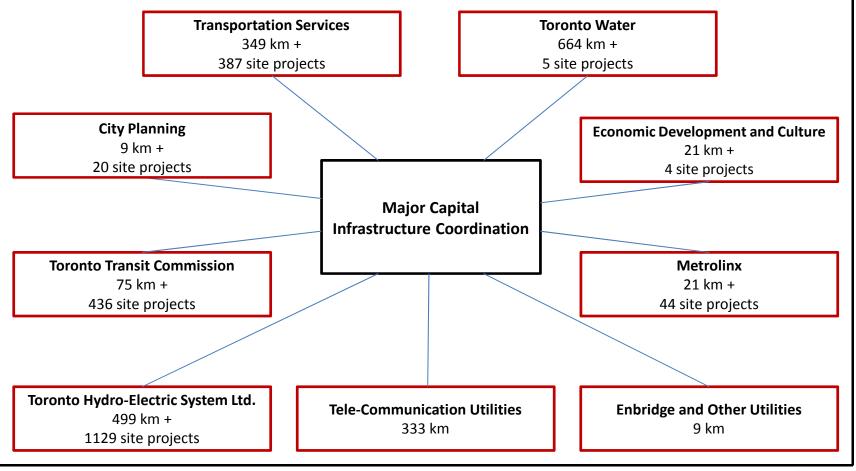
Key Service Levels Multi-year Capital Coordination

2013 & 2014 Projects Coordinated by MCIC (including projects delivered by ECS)





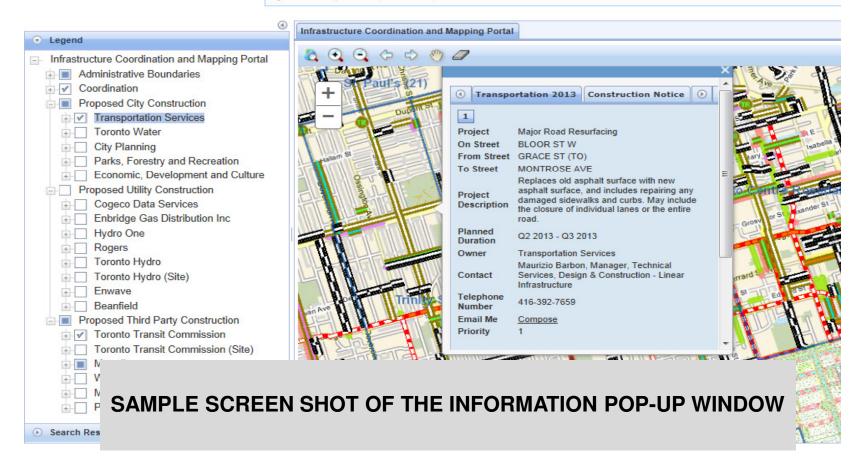

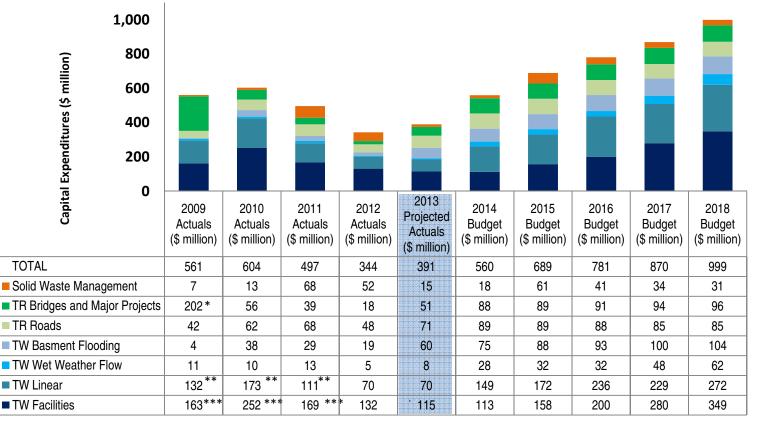
