The Mayor and Members of Toronto City Council are deeply saddened to learn of the passing of Mr. Paul Reichmann on Friday, October 25, 2013.

Mr. Reichmann was one of Canada's best known land developers. In 1975, his real estate company Olympia & York constructed First Canadian Place in downtown Toronto. A 72-storey building, it was the first of its kind in Canada, breaking the traditional mold of office buildings. He is credited with recreating skylines throughout the world including such projects as the Canary Wharf in London and the World Financial Centre complex in Manhattan.

As a philanthropist, Mr. Reichmann gave generously to Sunnybrook Hospital and many other hospitals and synagogues.
