**Proposed Changes to User Fees** 

The Council of the City of Toronto will be considering recommendations to pass by-laws to amend the City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 441, Fees and Charges, so as to adopt the changes to existing user fees and the new user fees that are proposed in the 2015 Staff Recommended Operating Budget. The 2015 Recommended Operating Budget will be considered by City Council on March 10 and 11, 2015.

The Budget Committee will make its final recommendations on February 20, 2015, which will be forwarded for consideration by the Executive Committee at its special meeting on March 2, 2015 and to City Council at its special meeting on March 10 and 11, 2015.

While the 2015 Staff Recommended Operating Budget sets out the recommended changes to existing user fees and new user fees, the appropriate Committee may change these recommendations.

Further, Toronto City Council may adopt fees that differ from the recommendations, including fees that are higher or lower than the fees being proposed, changes to fees for which no change is recommended, and may adopt additional new fees.
