

City of Toronto Act, 2006 Public Notice

Notice is given that the Chief Building Official and Executive Director, Toronto Building, is reporting on a proposal which seeks to amend Chapter 694, Signs, General, of the City of Toronto Municipal Code.

This report proposes amendments to the Sign By-law ("Chapter 694") to reduce the minimum fine levels from \$500 to \$250 for the erection, display, modification and/or restoration of first party signs without a sign permit or in contravention of an issued sign permit.

The Chief Building Official and Executive Director, Toronto Building is recommending that the Council of the City of Toronto amend Chapter 694, Signs, General, of the City of Toronto Municipal Code, in the manner proposed above.

At its meeting to be held in Toronto City Hall, Committee Room 1, on January 8, 2015 commencing at 9:30 a.m., or as soon as possible thereafter, the Planning and Growth Management Committee of Toronto City Council will hear in person or by his or her counsel, agent or solicitor, any person who wishes to speak to the matter.
