Joe is survived by his wife Kathy, children Cindy, Christine, Joe and Jennifer and was proud grandfather to Josh, Ian, and Trey.

Joe’s father and mother raised him and his three siblings in a house on Beresford Avenue. When he graduated from Runnymede Public School he went to Humberside Collegiate. After graduation from Humberside Joe studied dentistry at the University of Toronto.

He was a dedicated dentist and cared greatly for his patients. Many of whom stayed with him throughout his practice, some travelled great distances to have him care for them. He remained in his office above the store on the south west corner of Annette and Runnymede for 43 years, until last December.

To the people of Bloor West Village and Swansea Joe was known for his commitment and leadership at the Swansea Legion Branch 46. He was a familiar figure at Legion events and for many years he served on the executive in various elected positions and eventually became the longest running president of the branch for the last eight years until it closed in 2013.

Joe touched many lives. He was devoted to his family, his community, his dental practice and to Swansea Legion Branch 46 and was a lifelong resident of Toronto’s west end.
