Re: Item 11.2 - Noise By-law revisions - 591-3C

Dear Chair Palacio and Committee Members:

While the Toronto Industry Network agrees with the concept contained in section 591-3C regarding the exemption of stationary sources of noise that are permitted under Section 9 of the Environmental Protection Act (EPA), we ask that the following small but important changes be made to the By-law:

- 1. As we pointed out in our January 22, 2016 letter to your Committee that since an Environmental Compliance Approval (ECA) is a formal document under the EPA, the reference to the ECA in the By-law should be capitalized and have a definition sourcing it back to the EPA that could read: "An ECA is a formal approval issued by the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change (MOECC) under Section 9 of the EPA".
- 2. Because the MOECC has recently advised it is planning to change its process to reduce the number of facilities needing an ECA and switch "low-risk" industries to the Environmental Activity and Sector Registry (EASR), it would be helpful to change the wording of 591-3C to read:
  - "591-3C. from a stationery source where the emission of sound is in compliance with a provincial Environmental Compliance Approval or is registered on the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change/ Environmental Activity and Sector Registry and is in compliance with the requirements of , and regulations applying to such Registry".

We believe the changes we have suggested above will improve the interpretation of the Noise By-law and avoid the need to amend Section 591 - 3C again when MOECC changes its ECA process.
