Application Fee for Short Stream Utility Permits

- 1. City Council approve the application of the following user fees contained in City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 441, Fees and Charges, to all "short stream" utility cut permit applications, subject to the annual inflation rate:
 - a. Construction Permits Administration, Survey and Inspection Fee in the amount of \$93.87.
 - b. Construction Permits Permit fee to excavate/dig up/tear up or remove soil of any street/sidewalk/curbing, pavement, etc. in the amount of \$149.45.

The particulars of the proposed application fee for short stream utility permits are set out in the report to the Budget Committee from the General Manager, Transportation Services entitled "Application Fee for Short Stream Utility Permits", (the "Report").

The Budget Committee will make its final recommendations on May 11, 2017, which will be forwarded for consideration by the Executive Committee at its meeting on May 16, 2017 and then to City Council at its meeting on May 24, 25 and 26, 2017.

While the Application Fee for Short Stream Utility Permits report sets out the recommended fees, the appropriate Committee may change these recommendations.

Further, Toronto City Council may adopt fees that differ from the recommendations, including fees that are higher or lower than the fees set out in the Report, and may adopt additional new fees.

The adopted fees will be implemented through a by-law that will amend the Municipal Code, if necessary.
