Chapter 918 Technical Amendments: Clarifying the Landscaping Requirements for Front Yard Parking

Toronto City Council will be considering recommendations to pass a by-law to amend City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 918, Parking on Residential Front Yards and Boulevards, and City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 743, Streets and Sidewalks, Use Of, to eliminate conflict between Chapter 918 and the Zoning By-law (ZBL) in relation to the landscaped open space and soft landscaping requirements associated with parking pads
