## Re: Staff report on "Preparing the City of Toronto for Automated Vehicles"

On behalf of the Residential and Civil Construction Alliance of Ontario (RCCAO), I look forward to making a short deputation and showing a 2.5-minute animated YouTube video that our non-profit group produced to illustrate the role that governments could play in influencing the rollout of these new technologies.

The first report, <u>"Ontario Must Prepare for Vehicle Automation: Automated vehicles can influence urban</u> form, congestion and infrastructure delivery," was released in October 2016 and was lauded in a <u>Maclean's Magazine editorial in November 2016</u>.

The second report, <u>"Ontario Must Prepare for Vehicle Automation, Part 2: How Skilled Governance Can</u> <u>Influence its Outcome,"</u> was released in October 2017 along with an <u>animated video</u> to help amplify the report's message.

That later led to good media coverage, including <u>an op-ed written by report author and systems engineer</u> <u>Bern Grush for the *Toronto Star*</u> in November 2017.

Because of this leading-edge research, Mr. Grush was named the <u>Toronto Star Wheels section's</u> <u>Newsmaker of the Year for 2017</u>.
