# **2020 OPERATING BUDGET BRIEFING NOTE Toronto Public Library 2014-2020 History of Funding**

### **Issue/Background:**

At its meeting on January 17, 2020, Budget Committee requested the City Librarian to provide briefing notes on the following (BU14.2 Motion j #11):

- 1. the total amount of dollars contributed by the City since 2014;
- 2. the City's increase in funding since 2014;
- 3. the increase in Sunday service hours over the last five years; and
- 4. the City's proposed total investment in the 2020 budget.

This briefing note will address items #1, 2 and 4 with item #3 being addressed in a separate briefing note.

#### **Key Points:**

Toronto Public Library's (TPL) operating budget is primarily funded by the City of Toronto through property taxes which accounts for approximately 90% of the operating budget. The remaining approximately 10% of funding is from self-generated revenues (e.g. room booking fees, fines, printing), reserve contributions and funding from other levels of government.

## 2014-2019 City funding for TPL

Over the last six years (2014-2019), TPL's cumulative gross operating spending was \$1,188.8 million, of which \$1,066.2 million was funded by the City of Toronto and \$122.6 million was funded through other sources. The City's increase in funding from 2014-2019 is \$22.7 million or 13.7%, details shown in Table 1.

## New and Enhanced funding in detail:

- 2014: Funding for additional weekday hours to standardize service hours at all District and Research & Reference (R&R) branches (\$0.260 million);
- 2015: Fines forgiveness program and two additional Youth Hubs at Cedarbrae and York Woods (\$0.375 million);
- 2016: Two additional Youth Hubs at Fairview and Maria A. Shchuka, year-round Sunday service at six District and both R&R branches, seasonal Sunday service at six Neighbourhood branches, Wi-Fi hotspot lending program and a Digital Innovation Hub at the Malvern branch (\$0.958 million);
- 2017: Two additional Youth Hubs at McGregor Park and Weston, year-round Sunday service at six District branches and expansion of the Wi-Fi hotspot lending program (\$0.676 million);
- 2018: Three additional Youth Hubs at Downsview, Flemingdon Park and Malvern, year-round Sunday service at five District branches and seasonal Sunday service at nine Neighbourhood branches, further expansion of the Wi-Fi hotspot lending program and an e-Learning initiative (\$1.514 million in 2018, \$1.564 million annualized); and
- 2019: Two additional Youth Hubs at Parliament Street and Thorncliffe and seasonal Sunday service at eight Neighbourhood branches (\$0.468 million in 2019, \$0.676 million annualized).

City Staff Recommended 2020 Operating Budget for TPL is \$213.1 million gross of which the City's total portion is \$192.5 million, a net increase of \$4.4 million, or 2.3%, from projected 2019 actuals. This includes funding for budget enhancements comprised of two additional Youth Hubs at Jane/Dundas and Richview, seasonal Sunday service at eight Neighbourhood branches and a position to support Digital Literacy and Safety programming (\$0.719 million in 2020, \$0.987 million annualized).
