Toronto Water 2020 Capital Budget and 2021-2029 Capital Plan Adjustments

SUMMARY

This report requests City Council's authority to amend Toronto Water's Approved 2020 Capital Budget and 2021-2029 Capital Plan by adjusting project cash flows contained within the Budget and Plan, respectively, to align forecasted project accelerations and deferrals. Additional reallocations to project cashflows and project costs are requested where additional project costs exceed the current approved cashflow. These reallocations will allow Toronto Water to continue to deliver projects within its capital plan. The adjustments will have a zero dollar impact on the 2020 Capital Budget and 2021-2029 Capital Plan and will align the budget and plan with Toronto Water's capital project delivery schedule and program requirements.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The General Manager of Toronto Water recommends that:

- 1. City Council authorize the reallocation of cashflows within Toronto Water's approved 2020 Capital Budget and 2021-2029 Capital Plan in the amount of \$2.775 million, for acceleration and deferral of projects, as presented in Schedule A (Part A and B) to the report, with a zero Budget impact.
- 2. City Council authorize the reallocation of project costs and cashflows in Toronto Water's approved 2020 Capital Budget and 2021-2029 Capital Plan in the amount of \$5.136 million from projects that have been awarded under budget or completed to those requiring additional funding in the same amount as presented in Schedule A (Part C), with a zero Budget impact.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The approval of this report will authorize the acceleration and deferral of cashflows in Toronto Water's Approved 2020 Capital Budget and 2021-2029 Capital Plan in the total amount of \$2.775 million and the reallocation of 2021-2029 approved project costs and cash flows in the total amount of \$5.136 million as detailed in Schedule A (attached).

A number of multi-year projects are projected to proceed ahead of the forecast. The accelerated spending of these projects is off-set by delays within other projects where works are delayed due to delays in completing designs, due to coordination with other projects or delays to construction works as outlined in Schedule A (Part A and B).

As outlined in Part C of Schedule A, additional funding is required for two projects at the Wastewater Treatment Plants, and to support Water Service Replacement projects. The additional costs for these projects are to be offset from funds available from projects which have been completed under budget with funds available for reallocation.

There are no additional costs to the City as a result of the approval of this report. The recommended adjustments will align the 2020 Capital Budget and 2021-2029 Capital Plan with Toronto Water's capital project delivery schedule and program requirements.

The Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer has reviewed this report and agrees with the financial impact information.

DECISION HISTORY

City Council at its meeting of December 17 and 18, 2019 approved Toronto Water's 2020 Capital Budget and 2021-2029 Capital Plan, which included approval of a 2020 Capital Budget cash flow of \$1,217.837 million. The Council Decision Document can be found at:

COMMENTS

Toronto Water is seeking to amend the 2020 Approved Budget and 2021-2029 Capital Plan to better align the cash flows with capital project delivery and program requirements, primarily to address accelerated delivery of Trunk Sewer and Water Service replacement, and to address higher costs for two projects at the Wastewater Treatment Plants and the Water Service Replacement Program.

The majority of capital projects being delivered for Toronto Water are multi-year complex infrastructure projects. Accelerated spending, where projects are proceeding ahead of the forecast, as listed in Part A of Schedule A, can result from favourable weather/site conditions, and strong consultant/contractor performance.

Project under-spending, as listed in Part B of Schedule A, can arise from project delays. Project delays can arise from: delays in completing designs due to complexities within the infrastructure or site conditions, unforeseen ground/site conditions, delays resulting from inclement weather, delays resulting from technical coordination to maintain operations or address operational requirements, consultant/contractor performance issues, delays in executing agreements, delays in award and negotiation of final payments.

The funding adjustment for projects being delivered ahead of schedule is to be offset by projects that are behind schedule. Descriptions are provided in Parts A and B of Schedule A.

Additional funding is required for two projects at the Wastewater Treatment Plants: the Odour Control Upgrades at the Highland Creek Treatment Plant where the bid prices have exceeded the approved budget, and the Raw Sewage Pumping Station Rebuild Engineering project where additional engineering costs are required due to the project complexity and to address additional necessary design components. Additional funding is required to permit the continued tendering and contract award for Water Service Replacements scheduled for replacement in 2020 in conjunction with watermain, sewer and road reconstruction projects.

The additional costs are offset by projects which have been completed under budget as outlined in Schedule A (Part C).
