

## Waterfront East LRT: The benefits of accelerating construction






If the Waterfront East LRT were constructed by 2025 through the Port Lands, the following development would be supported by 2045:

67,000 new residents

132,000 new jobs

44% decrease in automobile use by incoming works and residents along the LRT corridor.
