Re: EC 23.2 – Downtown West Services and Facilities Review Re: St. Patrick's Market pop up use

Our community has been engaged with the St. Patrick's Market for decades, from the time of its identification as an important and historic community resource through the South East Spadina Planning reports of the 1970's.

We were elated by the recent court victory which returned the market to the city in order to meet its *intended and historic use* as a food market as noted in Councillor Cressy's amendment.

Our Association continues to be engaged with Ccouncillor Cressy and his team as well as with City staff.

We support the proposed direction and request that City Council give consideration to including the boulevards on the east and west sides of the market, including the cancellation of boulevard permits in the pedestrian walkway.

Therefore, we recommend that City staff work towards reclaiming the boulevard lanes along the east and west sides of the market, including the cancellation of boulevard café permits.
