PROPOSAL

The application proposes to amend the former City of Etobicoke Zoning Code and City-wide Zoning By-law 569-2013 to permit the construction of a 22 storey, mixed use building comprised of 259 rental apartment units and 1,209 m² of non-residential gross floor area at 5507 and 5509 Dundas Street West. The proposed development would have a Floor Space Index of approximately 6.56 times the area of the lot. The proposed Zoning By-law amendments would be subject to holding provisions.

Zoning By-law Amendments Appeal: If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the City of Toronto to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Toronto before the

proposed Zoning By-law Amendment is passed or refused, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision and may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal there are reasonable grounds to do so. You may submit comments to the City Clerk, attention: Nancy Martins, Administrator, Etobicoke York Community Council, at the address, fax number or e-mail set out in this notice.
