PROPOSAL

The City is proposing to amend the former City of Etobicoke Zoning Code, Site-specific Zoning By-law 1088-2002 and city-wide Zoning By-law 569-2013 for the lands located southeast of the intersection of Bloor Street West and Kipling Avenue municipally known as 3755 Bloor Street West (Block 4) to permit the development of the new Etobicoke Civic Centre. The City is also proposing to amend the former City of Etobicoke Zoning By-law to allow for loading manoeuvring movement in an underground section of the lands located southwest of the intersection of Bloor Street West and Dundas Street West (Block 3) in support of the new Etobicoke Civic Centre development.

The new Etobicoke Civic Centre will be located on Block 4 of the phased redevelopment of the former Six Points Interchange and would become the heart of the civic centre as envisioned in the Bloor-Kipling Block Context Plan. The tallest portions of the building are located along Bloor Street West, with heights gradually stepping down from the northeast corner of the site to northwest corner at Kipling Avenue beginning at a height of 16-storeys and stepping down to 12-storeys, 9-storeys and 6-storeys. The southern portion of the building, having the lowest heights between 3- to 4-storeys, fronts onto the 4,432 square metres civic square and contains all the public functions of the new Etobicoke Civic Centre including a new public library, day nursery, community recreation centre with pool, and a multi-purpose council chamber. The proposed gross floor area of the building is 44,677 square metres and a total of 420 parking spaces managed by the Toronto Parking Authority will be provided within the two-level underground garage. The proposed loading spaces and underground ramp will be shared with the adjacent site, identified as Block 3 of the Bloor-Kipling Block Context Plan.



Zoning By-law Amendment

Appeal: If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the City of Toronto to the Ontario Land Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Toronto before the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment is passed or refused, the person or public body



is not entitled to appeal the decision and may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Land Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal there are reasonable grounds to do so. You may submit comments to the City Clerk, Attention: Nancy Martins, Administrator, Planning and Housing Committee, at the address, fax number or e-mail set out in this notice.

People writing or making presentations at the public meeting: The *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, the *Planning Act*, and the City of Toronto Municipal Code authorize the City of Toronto to collect any personal information in your communication or presentation to City Council or its committees.

The City collects this information to enable it to make informed decisions on the relevant issue(s).
