The Mayor and Members of Toronto City Council are saddened to learn of the passing of Ronald Ross Clancy on January 29, 2021 at the age of 74.

Ron Clancy was born January 5, 1947 in Toronto, Ontario. Ron attended St. Thomas Moore Catholic School in Scarborough, followed by Cedarbrae and Woburn Collegiates. Ron moved west to attend Mount Royal University where he received Recreation certification. Upon graduation, Ron worked for several years in the City of Oshawa Recreation Department, followed by more than a quarter century as a Recreation Manager for the City of Scarborough. Known for his great sense of humour and fun-loving nature, Ron most enjoyed working in the City's arenas and community centres, as well as with the Scarborough Village Theatre.

Ron was an active community leader and advocate in his Treverton Park neighbourhood for the preservation of green spaces, a dedicated member of the Highland Yacht Club, and a passionate world traveller. In 2018, Ron and his wife Sandy moved to Brighton, Ontario where he continued his commitment to environmental causes by joining the Friends of Presqu'ile and volunteering for promotional activities on behalf of the organization.
