

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## **Action Plan Overview**

- The initial Downtown East Action Plan was developed in June 2018.
- Area has higher than City average levels of overdose, homelessness, mental health crisis, and community violence
- Developed to coordinate City services and address complex long term issues in the area.





## **Four Central Outcomes**



\* For the purposes of this plan, marginalization means lack of access to housing, mental health supports, or safe drug supply




# **Covid-19 Impact on the Downtown** East

- COVID-19 exacerbated existing health risks and vulnerabilities as well as socio-economic challenges
- Emergency orders limited access to services and spaces
- Action was needed to support people in the area, particularly vulnerable community members
- A range of financial supports, interventions and responses were launched

# New Investments through the Action Plan

# Community Outreach and Support Team (COAST):

March 2021 - March 2022

- 1,170 harm reduction kits
- 102 referrals

Low barrier, outreach based intensive case management services for individuals with multiple barriers to supports

### Here to Help (H2H):

April 2021 – March 2022

- 1,805 crisis visits (in person)
- 302 crisis calls (to crisis line)

Multidisciplinary team (e.g. community support workers, nursing, harm reduction workers) providing de-escalation and crisis intervention



# New Investments through the Action Plan

# Harm Reduction Community Care Project:

Feb 2021 - Feb 2022

- 5280 hours of low barrier employment
- 400 cleanups totalling 4,342 hours
- Pickup of 19,891 harm reduction supplies

#### A peer employment program providing pickup and safe disposal of drug use supplies

### **Equitable Action for Change:**

#### Feb – April 2022

- Over 1000 referrals and interactions
- 90% individuals identifying as homeless
- 95% living with substance use/addiction and/or mental health needs

A Black-led and serving agency providing low barrier harm reduction, crisis support, referral services, and outreach, particularly for individuals who identify as Indigenous, Black, racialized, 2SLGBTQ+



# **Complex Challenge in the Area**

- Need for appropriate responses to individuals with complex mental health needs
- Need for a range of affordable housing options including transitional and supportive housing.
- The post-traumatic impact of community violence.
- The drug toxicity crisis and challenged access to drug treatment.
- The cumulative impact of COVID-19 on the mental and physical health of frontline staff.
