



### **Status of the Study to date**

The City retained the planning and urban design firm of Urban Strategies to lead the first two of three phases for the study, supported by BA Consulting Group Ltd., who provided strategic advice on transportation and parking issues.

A Local Advisory Committee comprised of residents and business representatives from this area was also established, and worked with the consultants and City staff on this study.

City Planning staff are leading the third and final phase of the study, the implementation phase. This phase will result in a Final Report for consideration at a Public Meeting of Scarborough Community Council, targeted for consideration later this year. The report will include policy changes for this area, including zoning changes, and may recommend new Official Plan policies as well.

### **Purpose of the Community Consultation Meeting**

The purpose of this meeting is to inform the community and other stakeholders and to receive input on the recommendations that Planning staff are considering for this area.
