1. Hiring of a consultant to write the Terms of Reference for the Individual Environmental Assessment (EA) for a long-term waste management facility;
2. Results of the Request for Qualifications (RFQL) and plans for the Request for Proposals (RFP) for a small-scale research facility; and
3. Policies and Practices necessary to achieve the City's 60% waste diversion goal.
