



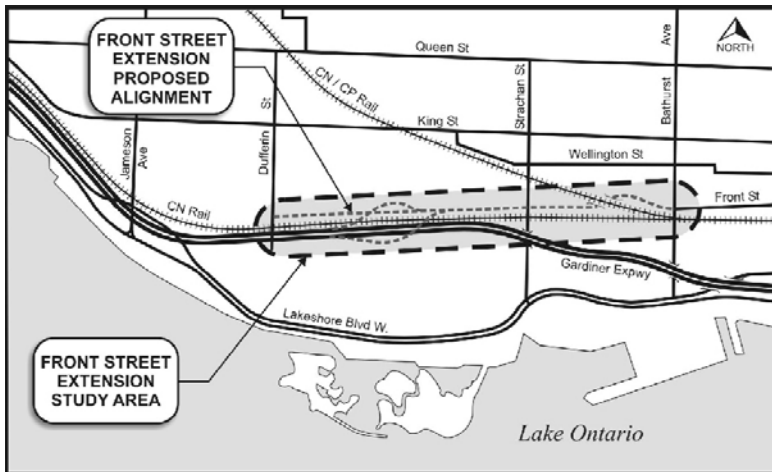
# Front Street Extension Environmental Assessment Study

## Notice of Public Meeting

### Background

The proposed extension of Front Street, from Bathurst Street to Dufferin Street including a new interchange with the Gardiner Expressway west of Strachan Avenue, has been an important component of the City's transportation plans for many years. The plan to revitalize Toronto's waterfront has provided the impetus to move ahead with the planning, approval and implementation of this project.

The City of Toronto's Works and Emergency Services Department, on behalf of the Toronto Waterfront Revitalization Corporation, is undertaking an Environmental Assessment (EA) Study for the Front Street Extension project to fulfill both federal and provincial requirements.



### Your Comments are Welcome

Stakeholders are being consulted throughout the project. The first point of contact was a newspaper advertisement and circulation of a notice of study commencement in early May, 2002. Now, the city will host an open house to discuss the project history, the need for the project, alternative road alignments and related issues and further opportunities for public involvement.
