

Front Street Extension - Class Environmental Assessment

Notice of Filing of Addendum, February 24, 2003

Front Street Extension Project Information

The City of Toronto's Works and Emergency Services Department, on behalf of the Toronto Waterfront Revitalization Corporation, has completed an Addendum to the previously approved Class Environmental Assessment for the Front Street Extension. This project is one of four priority projects which the Waterfront Corporation has been mandated to oversee.

The Recommended Plan

The recommended plan for the Front Street Extension is comprised of two integrated transportation links:

- (i) an extension of Front Street from Bathurst Street to Dufferin Street, consisting of a four-lane cross-section between Bathurst Street to a new intersection just east of Strachan Avenue, and a two-lane cross-section between Strachan Avenue and Dufferin Street; and
- (ii) an interchange with the Gardiner Expressway between Strachan Avenue and Dufferin Street

Anyone having a concern with the Front Street Extension Project is encouraged to contact the City of Toronto to discuss his or her concerns. If the concerns cannot be resolved in discussions with the City of Toronto, then members of the public may request that the Minister of the Environment make an order for the project to comply with Part II of the Environmental Assessment Act (referred to as a Part II Order) which addresses individual environmental assessments. Part II Order requests must detail the issues of concern and the rationale behind the request. Requests must be received by the Minister at the address listed here by March 26, 2003. A copy of the Part II Order request must also be sent to the City of Toronto at the address listed here. If no Part II Order requests are received by March 26, 2003, the City of Toronto may proceed with the design and construction of the Front Street Extension.
