



**Six Points Interchange Reconfiguration  
Glossary of Terms  
March 2, 2004**

**Arterial Road** – a road that provides relatively high traffic service levels with some property access

**City Building** - the process by which planning objectives are realized through new development opportunities and capital works projects

**Class Environmental Assessment** - a provincially legislated process that must be undertaken when proposing any major municipal roadwork

**Collector Road** - a road that serves to collect traffic from local streets and distribute it to arterial roads while still providing property access

**Etobicoke Centre Secondary Plan** - a planning policy document, approved by City Council (November 2002), guiding new development and reinvestment in Etobicoke Centre

**Grade Separation** - one roadway crossing above or below another using a bridge or tunnel

**Above Grade** - above the level of the surrounding land

**At-Grade Intersection** - two roads intersecting at the same level with each other

**Below Grade** - below the level of the surrounding land

**Pedestrian scale building-to-street relationship** – promote a streetscape that is compatible with pedestrian activity

**Property Fabric** - existing pattern of property subdivision/ownership

**Streetscape** - the design of a street including sidewalks, boulevards and plantings, building faces, and the traveled roadway

**Study Area** - the area within which we would consider changes and impacts

**Traffic Level of Service** - a quantitative measure that describes how traffic flows on a road.

**Westwood Theatre Lands** - City owned lands bounded by Bloor Street to the north, Kipling Avenue to the west and the TTC subway line/Canadian Pacific Railway to the south and east
