

Six Points Interchange Reconfiguration

Class Environmental Assessment

Public Meeting and Open House

The Opportunity

The City of Toronto is investigating the potential reconfiguration of the Six Points interchange, the area where Kipling Avenue, Dundas Street West, and Bloor Street West meet. Reconfiguration would improve the streetscape, assist movement for pedestrians and cyclists, improve vehicle access to the adjacent Westwood Theatre lands, and potentially create new development opportunities on surplus interchange lands.

The Study

The study is being undertaken in accordance with the guidelines for a Schedule 'C' Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA). The Class EA is an approved process under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act, and defines the steps the City must follow when planning to implement changes to a roadway.

As part of the planning process for this Class EA study, a number of alternative reconfigurations of the Six Points Interchange have been identified. These alternatives will be presented at a public meeting.

We would like to hear from you

Public consultation is vital to this study. It is important that your comments or concerns relating to this study be known early so that they can be incorporated in the development and assessment of alternatives. The first public meeting will present the need and justification for this study, the list of alternatives identified to date, and the evaluation criteria that will be used to assess the alternatives.
