## Class Environmental Assessment

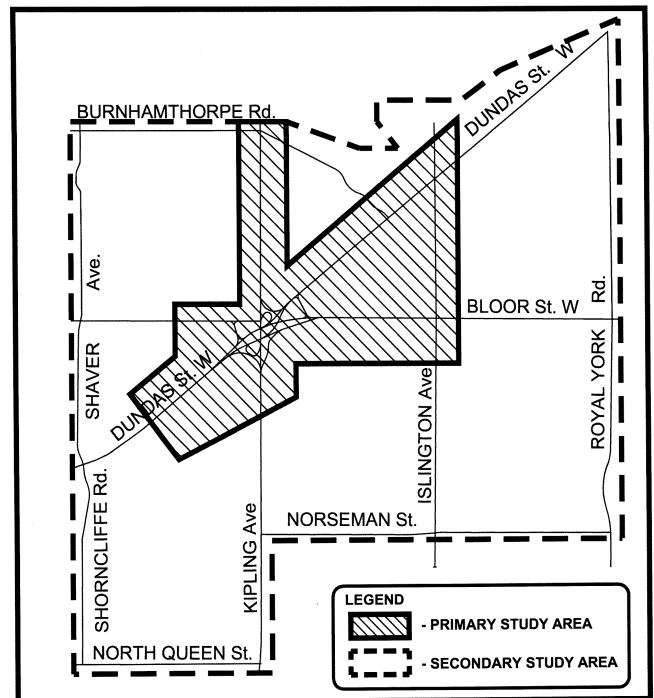
### Second Public Meeting and Open House

#### The Background

In November 2003, the City of Toronto initiated the Six Points Interchange Reconfiguration Class Environmental Assessment (EA). The Six Points interchange refers to the area where three major arterial roads meet: Kipling Avenue, Dundas Street West, and Bloor Street West. The purpose of the study is to investigate the potential to reconfigure the interchange in such a way as to improve access to adjacent Sites, enhance the connectivity and amenity for pedestrians and cyclists, potentially release surplus lands for future development, and improve the cohesiveness and unity of the streetscape and property fabric. The study is being undertaken as a Schedule 'C' project under the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment process.

#### We would like to hear from you

Public consultation is vital to this study. We want to ensure that anyone with an interest in this study has the opportunity to get involved and provide input. The first Public Open House was held on Tuesday, March 2, 2004. Information was presented on: (1) the study background, (2) the study purpose, (3) needs and opportunity, (4) problem statement, (5) a 'long' list and a 'short' list of options, and (6) criteria for evaluation of the 'long' list, and 'short' list of options.
