

# **Phase 1: Sidewalk Reconstruction on St. Clair Avenue Yonge Street (Ferndale Avenue) to Avenue Road**

Commencing the week of September 19, the City of Toronto will begin reconstructing the sidewalks on St. Clair Avenue from Ferndale Avenue (just east of Yonge Street) to Avenue Road.

Sidewalks are being reconstructed to improve safety for pedestrians and to restore and enhance the appearance of the street.

## **Sidewalk Reconstruction Details**

- Construction will start on St. Clair Avenue at Ferndale Avenue and move west to Avenue Road.
- Pedestrian access to businesses and residences will be maintained during construction. Temporary walkways will be built over the excavated areas of sidewalk to storefronts and residences on St. Clair Avenue.
- Safety measures such as barrier fences will be in place.
- Efforts will be made to minimize construction noise.
- Sidewalk reconstruction will take approximately 3 days in front of each property.

## **Work Hours**

Sidewalk reconstruction work will take place between the hours of 7am and 7pm Monday to Saturday.

# Streetcar Track Reconstruction

## St. Clair Avenue

### Yonge Street to Ferndale Avenue (St. Clair Station)

Commencing the week of September 19, the City of Toronto and the Toronto Transit Commission will be reconstructing the streetcar tracks on St. Clair Avenue from Yonge Street east to Ferndale Avenue.

**Start date: Week of September 19, 2005**

\*Timelines are subject to change due to weather conditions and/or any other unforeseen events.

### Construction Details

- Noise should be expected. Every effort will be made to minimize construction noise during periods of 24-hour operations.
- Pedestrian sidewalk traffic and access to businesses will be maintained during construction.
- Temporary pedestrian walkways will be placed at excavated areas where traffic lights and crosswalks exist.
- Garbage collection will not change. Please follow your normal routine.
- Signs will be posted to notify pedestrians and vehicles of temporary traffic and parking changes.
- Safety measures such as barrier fences will be in place.

### Work Hours

Streetcar track construction is a 24-hour operation. All heavy construction work will take place between the hours of 7 a.m. to 11 p.m., Monday to Friday, with weekend work as required. The overnight operation involves TTC rail installation work consisting of delivery of rail, rail installation and rail welding. This work is required to support the daytime construction. Working 24-hours is a necessity in order to complete the project as quickly as possible.

### Vehicle Restrictions

One lane of westbound traffic will be maintained during track work east of Yonge Street. Reconstruction of the Yonge/St. Clair intersection is scheduled from September 28 to October 4. Through traffic on Yonge Street will be prohibited at some times. Signs will be posted to notify pedestrians and vehicles of temporary traffic changes.

### Parking Restrictions

No on-street parking will be available within the active work zones until track reconstruction is complete. Signs will be posted to notify pedestrians and vehicles of temporary parking changes.
