

Volumes Crossing St. Clair (North – South)

Pedestrian volumes crossing St. Clair Avenue were high at Bathurst Street, Vaughan Road and Dufferin Street, ranging between 400 and 600 pedestrian crossings per hour. Pedestrian volumes crossing St. Clair were particularly high at Yonge Street ranging between 400 to 800 crossings during the p.m. peak and averaging in excess of 800 crossings per hour during the midday peak.

Cycling volumes were typically less than 20 cyclists per hour at most of the crossing locations observed. However, cyclist volumes crossing St. Clair were higher between Bathurst and Dufferin Streets. Cyclist volumes across St. Clair Avenue ranged between 40 and 60 cyclists per hour at Dufferin Street during the a.m. peak and at Oakwood Avenue during the midday. Cyclist volumes exceeded 60 cyclists per hour at Christie Street during the p.m. peak hour. Mid-day and a.m. peak demands are similar.
