

David Shugarman has been Director of the York University Centre for Practical Ethics since July 1, 1999. He has served on both the Executive Council and Board of Directors of the Centre since its inception. Professor Shugarman is also currently completing his second term as Master of McLaughlin College.

A Professor of Political Science, he has been a member of the Department of Political Science at York University since 1971 and is a former Director of the Graduate Social and Political Thought Programme. He has served as both Senior Tutor and Acting Master of Bethune College. He was also a founding member of the Toronto Centre for Social Justice and once served on its Board of Directors.

Some of the books that Professor Shugarman has published over the past few years include *Honest Politics: Seeking Integrity in Canadian Public Life* (James Lorimer & Co., 1977), co-written with fellow YCPE executive member Ian Greene; and *Cruelty and Deception: The Controversy Over Dirty Hands in Politics* (Broadview Press, 1999), which he co-edited with Paul Rynard.

He is currently the principal investigator of an SSHRC sponsored research project on “Ethics and International Intervention” which includes three York research centers, five York faculty members and a multi-disciplinary research center in Brisbane, Australia.
