**Objection to the Designation of  
140-150 Borough Drive  
Scarborough Civic Centre  
(Ward 38 - Scarborough Centre)**

*(City Council on May 21, 22 and 23, 2002, adopted this Clause, without amendment.)*

**The Scarborough Community Council recommends:**

- (1) the adoption of the following report (April 5, 2002) from the City Clerk; and**
- (2) the City Solicitor be requested to support the efforts of the Scarborough Preservation Panel in the designation of the Scarborough Civic Centre.**

Purpose:

To notify City Council of an Objection to Designate 140-150 Borough Drive for architectural and historical reasons under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act.

Financial Implications and Impact Statement:

There are no financial implications resulting from the adoption of this report.

Recommendations:

It is recommended that:

- (1) in accordance with Subsection 29 (7) of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18, the matter be referred to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing and report; and
- (2) the appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

Background:

Pursuant to action of City Council at its regular meeting held on February 13, 14 and 15, 2002 (Scarborough Community Council Report No. 2, Clause No. 1) Notice of Intention to Designate 140-150 Borough Drive as a property of architectural value or interest was served on the owner

and the Ontario Heritage Foundation and, also in accordance with Section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, notice of such intention was published in a newspaper on March 4, 2002.

Comments:

Both the Notice of Intention and the newspaper insertion stated that any objection be served on the City Clerk within thirty days. The thirty day period ended on April 4, 2002. An objection has been received, and the relevant correspondence is attached.

Conclusions:

Subsection 29 (7) of the Ontario Heritage Act provides “where a notice of objection has been served under subsection (5), the council shall, upon expiration of the thirty day period under subsection (4), refer the matter to the Review Board for a hearing and report.”
