Minutes of the Toronto East York Community Council

Meeting No. 7

Wednesday, July 17, 2002

The Toronto East York Community Council met on Wednesday, July 17, 2002, in Committee Room No. 1, 2nd Floor, City Hall, Toronto, commencing at 9:30 a.m.

No interests were declared pursuant to the Municipal Conflict of Interest Act.

7.10 Inclusion on the City of Toronto Inventory of Heritage Properties – 3 Elm Avenue (“Denbrae”/William Alexander House) and 4 Elm Avenue (William Warren House) (Toronto Centre-Rosedale, Ward 27)

The Toronto East York Community Council had before it a report (June 5, 2002) from the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism respecting Inclusion on the City of Toronto Inventory of Heritage Properties – 3 Elm Avenue “Denbrae”/William Alexander House) and 4 Elm Avenue (William Warren House), and recommending that:

- (1) City Council include the following properties on the City of Toronto Inventory of Heritage Properties:
 - (a) 3 Elm Avenue (“Denbrae”/William Alexander House);
 - (b) 4 Elm Avenue (William Warren House);
- (2) the listing of the properties at 3 and 4 Elm Avenue will come into effect when Council’s Bills for the Official Plan Amendment and Rezoning for Branksome Hall come into effect; and
- (3) the appropriate City Officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

- (2) the alterations substantially as shown in Attachment No. 4, (Proposed Alterations & Addition) be approved by City Council;
- (3) that the owner provide a Conservation Plan prior to the issuance of any building permits, regarding the selective removal of heritage fabric, stabilization of the structure and the exterior conservation of the heritage building, prepared by a

conservation architect, that meets with the satisfaction of the Manager of Heritage Preservation Services;

- (4) that the owner provide record of the as-found condition of the buildings on the site prior to the issuance of any building permits, that meets with the satisfaction of the Manager of Heritage Preservation Services;
- (5) that the owner post a Letter of Credit prior to the issuance of any building permits, for the implementation of the Conservation Plan, that meets with the satisfaction of the Manager of Heritage Preservation Services; and
- (6) that the appropriate City Officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.

On motion by Councillor Layton, the Toronto East York Community Council recommended the adoption of the foregoing report (June 5, 2002) from the Commissioner of Economic Development, Culture and Tourism.

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- (d) that the owner provide a record of the as-found condition of the structure, plans, and specifications, prior to the issuance of any building permits, that meet with the satisfaction of the Manager of Heritage Preservation Services;
 - (e) that the owner post a Letter of Credit prior to the issuance of any building permits, which is consistent with cost estimates to be provided by the owner for the implementation of the conservation work described by plans and specifications (dated April 22, 2002) as provided by the owner, that meet with the satisfaction of the Manager of Heritage Preservation Services; and
- (2) that the appropriate City Officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto.
