## **Bill 720**

## BY-LAW -2025

To amend City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 227, Reserves and Reserve Funds, to close the Housing Allowance Reserve, the Home Improvement Reserve Fund and the MLTT (Municipal Land Transfer Tax) Stabilization Reserve Fund, and amend the Social Housing Stabilization Reserve, the MLTT (Municipal Land Transfer Tax) Stabilization Reserve and the Paver Maintenance Reserve Fund.

The Council of the City of Toronto enacts:

- 1. Municipal Code Chapter 227, Reserves and Reserve Funds, is amended by:
  - A. closing and deleting the Housing Allowance Reserve from Appendix A, Schedule 1 Corporate Reserves;
  - B. closing and deleting the Home Improvement Reserve Fund from Appendix B, Schedule 9 – Community Initiatives Reserve Funds;
  - C. amending the Paver Maintenance Reserve Fund in Appendix B, Schedule 8 State of Good Repair Discretionary Reserve Funds, as follows:

D. amending the Social Housing Stabilization Reserve in Appendix A, Schedule 3 – Stabilization Reserves, as follows:

- F. establishing and adding MLTT (Municipal Land Transfer Tax) Stabilization
